TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PRESCHOOL TO GRADE 12 FINANCIAL AID AWARD

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- Recipient must re-apply for a financial aid award each year and meet all of the program eligibility requirements. Only completed applications postmarked by the deadline will be considered.
- Award is made annually and is based on financial need.
- KS may request the submission of a completed IRS form 4506-T Request for Transcript of Tax Form as determined to verify applicant's financial data.
- Award amounts and Terms and Conditions may differ each year and amounts are subject to the availability of funds.
- Award may be full or partial.
- Award amounts reflect the maximum annual amount which the recipient is eligible to receive from Kamehameha Schools (KS).
- Failure to meet the Terms and Conditions as stated may cause the recipient to be disqualified for consideration under the program in subsequent years.
- Award is non-transferable to another recipient, academic year or KS program.
- Any lawsuit or claim against KS must be brought exclusively in the U.S. District Court for the District of Hawai'i or in the state courts of the State of Hawai'i. Any federal claims shall be governed exclusively by the federal law applied by the U.S. District Court for the District of Hawai'i, and any state law claims shall be governed exclusively by the laws of the State of Hawai'i, without reference to its conflict of law rules.

2. TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE

- Tuition – Covers the cost of instruction, lunches (all students are required to participate in the meal plan), classroom supplies, instructional materials, class dues, and yearbook.
- Bus (for day students residing in O'ahu zip codes 96701 through 96797 and 96825 and students attending Maui and Hawai'i campuses) – KS bus service to/from designated locations for students assigned a seat on a KS bus route. (KS does not provide financial aid awards for the cost of travel on city buses, other non-KS bus services, or in private vehicles.)
 - Students who are not assigned a space on a KS bus (no matter the reason) will not receive a refund of any transportation financial aid award and may not transfer the award to another category.
- Inter-island Airfare (for boarding students from neighbor islands only) – Hawaiian Airlines (group travel only) service for up to 4.5 round trip (RT) airfares to be used by the student to travel to and from their home island on the following designated weekends and holidays **only**:
 - ✓ October common weekend (RT)
 - ✓ Thanksgiving (RT)
 - ✓ Christmas (RT)
 - ✓ Spring Break (RT)
 - ✓ End of year travel (**one way**)

All other common weekends are NOT covered by financial aid. Trips are not transferable or refundable.

3. SUPPLEMENTAL AWARD [For AFDC/TANF recipients and Wards of Court (WOC)]
 - Bookstore (Grade 7 to 12 Kapālama recipients or wards only)
Eligible students are awarded \$75 for the school year to purchase class books/supplies at the Kapālama Campus Bookstore. Students are not allowed to purchase clothing, uniforms and certain logo items with funds from this account. Parent(s)/Legal Guardian(s) will be billed for unauthorized purchases. Unused awards at the end of the academic year will not carry over and will not be disbursed or refunded to the student.
 - Monthly Allowance (Grades 7 to 12 boarding recipients or wards only)
Eligible boarding students may receive up to \$30 per month for nine (9) months for miscellaneous expenses such as laundry soap, bath soap, shampoo, etc. The allowance will be deposited in the student's account at the KS Cashier's Office in the Princess Bernice Pauahi Administration Building. Students may only withdraw up to \$30 each month. Unused awards at the end of the academic year will not carry over and will not be disbursed or refunded to the student.
4. CHANGES IN RECIPIENT STATUS
 - Financial aid awards are adjusted for any change in a recipient's status (i.e. "Boarding to Day" or "Day to Boarding").
 - Recipients who are released from school due to expulsion, disenrollment, or withdrawal will be responsible for any remaining account balances after adjustments to their financial aid awards are made.
5. MINIMUM FAMILY CONTRIBUTION
 - Families are expected to contribute a minimum annual amount of \$100 toward their child's education.
6. FUTURE FUNDS
 - Recipients with unpaid account balances are subject to the following:
 - Late charges
 - Suspension of enrollment
 - Denial of registration of underclassmen and their siblings who have applied for admission
 - Denial of graduation ceremonies attendance privileges to seniors
 - Disqualification from receiving any Post-High scholarships
 - Disqualification from receiving any future KS financial aid and/or scholarships.
