Pauahi Keiki Scholars & Kipona Scholarship Ho'oulu Kaiāulu Guide



Families of scholarship recipients are required to participate in Hawaiian culture, community service, and enrichment activities known as Ho'oulu Kaiāulu to remain eligible for scholarship awards. The required number of activity hours range from 10 to 20 hours per year, depending on the age of the recipient and scholarship program. Ho'oulu Kaiāulu activities give scholarship recipients and their families an opportunity to cultivate Native Hawaiian identity through cultural engagement, leadership, and service.

To ensure that families and students have a well-rounded experience, the required activities are grouped into the following categories:

PAPAHANA

(Workshops)

Activities that foster personal growth and knowledge into daily life.

Examples:

-Attending your school's parent orientation

-Taking a financial literacy course

'IKE/NOHONA

(Hawaiian Culture)

Activities that give families the opportunity to learn about the Hawaiian culture.

Examples:

-Volunteering to clear invasive species from a fishpond.

-Harvesting and cleaning kalo at a lo'i kalo.

E KŌKUA

KĀKOU

(Community Service)

Activities that you complete with non-profit organizations

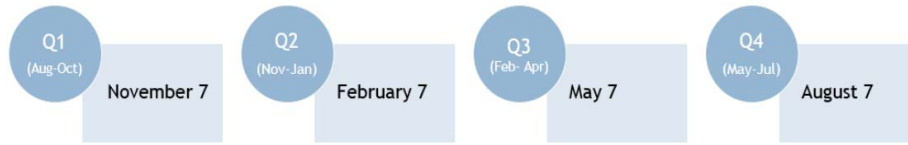
Examples:

-Serving food to homeless families

-Teaching an activity for kupuna at a senior center.

HO'OU LU KAIĀULU HOURS

PAUHI KEIKI SCHOLARS (PKS)



SERVICE HOURS: 5 hours per quarter (20 total hours)
ATTENDANCE: 85% attendance
No more than 3 days of unexcused absences

- Failure to meet any requirements may result in delayed disbursements, award suspension and/or termination for the current award year.
- **For returning recipients**, your award is contingent upon completion of receipt of requirements for the 2017-2018 award year.

KIPONA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



Deadline: June 30 each year
Categories: Papahana (workshop)
Ike/Nohona (Hawaiian knowledge & culture)
E kōkua kākou (Community Service)
Total service hours can be allocated among these three categories.

- Kipona recipient is responsible for completing and submitting *Ho'oulu Kaiāulu Report* by **July 15, 2019**
- Final report card must be emailed or mailed by July 31 deadline.
