

HE KI'INA HO'OKUANA'IKE MAULI HAWAI'I MA KE KĀLAILAI MO'OKALALEO

He pepa kēia e kālailai ana i ka meiwi mo'okalaleo me ka hualekikona i loko o ke kuana'ike Kumu Honua Mauli Ola. Ke ho'opili 'ia ia 'ike i ka hana noi'i mo'okalaleo, he mea ia meiwi mo'okalaleo me ka hualekikona e ahuwale ai kahi iwihilo o ka mo'olelo, 'a'ole wale nō 'o ka 'ike o loko, ma nā hi'ohi'ona pū nō na'e i kāpilipili 'ia ai a pa'a pono. Hele nō ho'i a walea ma ia 'ike kāpilipili mo'olelo ku'una, he 'ike nō ho'i ia e ho'ormana'o 'ia ai ke ola hou 'ana a'e o ka 'olelo Hawai'i ma kona 'ano Hawai'i iho nō mai nā kūpuna mai. Inā pēlā, na'auao pili nō ho'i ka pāpā 'olelo 'ana, ke kākau mo'olelo 'ana, ke kākā'olelo 'ana ho'i, a ia 'olelo Hawai'i aku, ia 'olelo Hawai'i aku o kēia au e ō ai kona welo kupuna pili no ko kēia mua mau aku nō.

E HO'OUNA I KOU MANA'O IA:

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Ma kēia ‘atikala nei, e hō‘ike ana wau no ka‘u ki‘ina ho‘okuana‘ike mauli Hawai‘i i kino iho ma ko‘u ‘imi ‘ana e ho‘omohala i ka ha‘i‘ōlelo Hawai‘i mai loko mai o ka mo‘olelo ku‘una.¹ Ma ka holo ‘ana o nā makahiki o ko‘u kilo ‘ana i ka mo‘okalaleo ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i (mo‘oka‘ao, mo‘olelo, piliolana, leka nūpepa, leka ho‘ālohaloha, a pēlā aku), laupa‘i wale a‘ela ko‘u mahalo palena ‘ole i ka waiwai lua ‘ole o ua waihona mo‘olelo kahiko nei i mea ho‘omohala ‘ike Hawai‘i e like me ka mea i ho‘oholo ‘ia i loko o ke kaila kūkulu mana‘o me ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i. Ho‘olōkahi iholo au he ki‘ina makakolu nui o ia ho‘onui ‘ike ‘ana penei: (1) he kilo i ke kuana‘ike kālaimana‘o ‘o Ke Kumu Honua Mauli Ola (KHMO; ‘Aha Pūnana Leo a me Ka Haka ‘Ula O Ke‘elikōlani, 2009) i mea e hō‘ike pono ‘ia ai ka ‘i‘o o ka ‘ike; (2) he kilo i ka hualekikona i mea e hō‘oia ‘ia ai ka pili pono o ka ‘ōlelo i kona kumuhana; a (3) he kilo i ka meiwi mo‘okalaleo i mea e hō‘oia ‘ia ai ke kaila pono ‘ana o ka ‘ōlelo mai ke kumu mai o ke kaila ‘ōlelo a kākau a nā kūpuna i ho‘opa‘a iho ai. ‘O ia ki‘ina makakolu ka‘u ki‘ina nui i ho‘ā‘o ai a i ho‘okolohua ai i loko o ka ‘ōlelo me ka ha‘i‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana, a ho‘oili akula wau pēlā ma ke ‘ano he ha‘awina ho‘oulu na ka haumāna.

Ma waho aku o ka‘u i ki‘i ai i ia ki‘ina makakolu i mea ho‘omohala ha‘i‘ōlelo, ua mōakāka le‘a nō kona kūlana keu ho‘i a ka maika‘i wale nō i ha‘awina ho‘omohala ‘ike ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ma ke ‘ano nui laulā. I loko o kēia wā ulu nui o ka ‘i‘ini o kānaka e ho‘oikaika ma nā ‘ike Hawai‘i like ‘ole, he mea kēia ki‘ina e kōkua ai ma ka ho‘omana‘o ‘ana i nā hi‘ohi‘ona like ‘ole o ka heluhelu ‘ana i ka mo‘olelo ku‘una, ‘a‘ole ho‘i he mea heluhelu e heluhelu wale ‘ia ai. He mea nui ka ‘ike ‘ana o ka mea a‘o ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i o kēia au pehea e ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ai, ‘a‘ole wale nō ma ka pololei o ka hua‘ōlelo me ka pilina‘ōlelo hou e a‘o ‘ia i loko o ka lumi papa. E kia‘i pū a‘e nō na‘e i ke kaila o ke kūkulu ‘ana i ka mana‘o Hawai‘i, me ka ho‘oholo ‘ana i ia mana‘o Hawai‘i i loko o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i mai ke kumu mai ma ka nui loa i hiki, ma kahi o ka “‘ōlelo Hawai‘i” e hahai ana i ka ‘ōlelo me ka mana‘o Pelekānia.

Eia ma lalo nei ko‘u kūkā ‘ana no ia ki‘ina makakolu, ma ka nui loa aku, no ka meiwi mo‘okalaleo. He kāka‘ikahi ho‘i ke pa‘i ‘ana no ia kumuhana, a oki loa ka pa‘a ‘ole o kekahī palapala nui kūpono no ka meiwi ma ke ‘ano piha ma loko ho‘i o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i.² No ke KHMO, e kūkā ‘ia ka‘u mau nīnau alaka‘i i ho‘omohala ‘ia mai loko mai nō o ia kālaimana‘o o ke ‘ano he mau nīnau ia e ho‘okele ana i ka ho‘opa‘a ‘ike ma ka heluhelu me ka noi‘i ‘ana i ka mo‘olelo ku‘una. ‘O ke kālailai hualekikona, he kumuhana manomano ākea nō ho‘i ia nona iho nō, keu ke ho‘opili pono aku ma nā ki‘ina ho‘ola me ka ho‘omāhuahua kuana‘ike ‘ōlelo ola. ‘A‘ole nō e lele ana kēia nui kino i loko o ia ki‘owai, koe ma ke kapo‘o ‘ana he wahi wai e akāka ai nā mana‘o nui e pili pū ana e ‘ike ‘ia ai ka hualekikona mo‘olelo Hawai‘i kahiko.³

No Ke Kumu Honua Mauli Ola

No loko mai o ua KHMO nei i pa'a maila he 'oloke'a e unuhi 'ia mai ai ka 'ike no loko mai o ka hāpana mo'okalaleo e noi'i 'ia. 'O ka'u kālailaina haku nīnau ho'okele ka mea ko'iko'i e kē 'ia ma lalo nei, 'a'ole 'o ia kālaimana'o ho'ona'auao pono'i iho nō. Ma ka ho'ākāka laulā nō na'e, he mea ke Kumu Honua Mauli Ola e ho'opono ana ma luna o ke kūlana ea 'i'o o ke Kanaka he Hawai'i o kona mau 'ano iho nō a pau. Ho'omana'o 'ia nā 'ao'ao 'ehā o ua mauli kanaka nei. He 'IKE KU'UNA, he 'ike kupuna ho'i e mau ai ka welo Hawai'i i loko o ke kani mo'opuna 'ana. He PILI 'UHANE e ho'omana'o 'ia ai ke kuana'ike 'uhane Hawai'i. He LAWENA e pa'a mau ai ka lawe a ke kino, me ka lawelawe 'ana i nā hana a pau, i loko o ke 'ano Hawai'i. A laila aku he 'OLELO e ho'omana'o pono 'ia ai ka 'ōlelo a ko Hawai'i Pono'i iho nō, he 'ōlelo Hawai'i.

'Ike 'ia ke ola o ia mau 'ao'ao a pau 'ehā i loko o nā piko 'ekolu o ka mauli kanaka. He PIKO 'I o ka manawa e haka mai ai ka 'ike me ka na'auao o ka pō. He PIKO 'Ō, 'o ka piko ma'amau o ka 'ōpū, kahi 'ike laha 'ia e kānaka, e ho'omana'o ana i ka pilina mo'okū'auhau. A laila aku he PIKO 'Ā, 'o ka "piko" le'ale'a o kānaka (ma'i), e ho'omana'o ana i ka paepae haku na ke kanaka aku e mau ai ke ola o ka Hawai'i 'ana i loko o kēia kikilo mua aku.

E HONUA ana ho'i ka mauli kanaka ma kona mau wahi nui 'ekolu. Ma ka HONUA 'IEWE o ka pū'ao o ka makuahine o ka hānau 'ana, 'o ia kahi honua mua loa e 'i'o ai ke aka o ke kanaka a ulu a'e a puka auane'i i ke ao. Ma ka HONUA KĪPUKA o ka pilina pō'ai 'ohana o ka hānai 'ana, 'o ia kahi honua hou aku e piha ai ka 'i'o o ke kanaka. A laila aku ma ka HONUA AO HOLO'OKO'A o ka pilina i ko ke ao laulā a puni, 'o ia kahi honua hou aku e mohala ai ke kanaka, he hoa lāhui kānaka o ke ao.

'O ka mea hiehie loa na'u o ua kālaimana'o ho'ona'auao KHMO nei, 'o ia kona 'ano 'oloke'a e ho'omana'o ana i ia mau hi'ohi'ona nui o ka mauli Hawai'i me ke koi 'ole 'ana i ka 'i'o e piha ai. I mea ho'i kēia e 'imi ai ke kanaka i kona ho'opihā 'ana iho nō, a hua nona iho nō kona 'i'o mauli Hawai'i. 'A'ole nō koi ia KHMO i kekahī 'ano Hawai'i hāiki iho nō, 'oiai 'o ke 'ano Hawai'i ka mea nui.

A hala a'e he wā o ko'u kālailai 'ana i ua KHMO nei, a ma'a ihola ia'u ia kālaimana'o i loko o ko'u heluhelu 'ana i ka mo'olelo kahiko, kāpili ihola wau he mau nīnau ho'okele e like me ka'u e maka'ala ana i ka 'ike no loko mai o ko'u heluhelu 'ana. Eia ma lalo nei ka'u mau nīnau ho'okele e ho'omohala 'ia ai ka 'ike no loko mai o ka mo'okalaleo ku'una.

1. He aha ka la‘ana/hāpana mo‘omeheu e kālailai ‘ia?
 - He mea nui kēia ho‘omaopopo ‘ana i nā pō‘aiapili mo‘omeheu o ka heluhelu ‘ana. I kahi wā, e kuhi ana ka mea kākau mo‘olelo i ka pō‘aiapili mo‘omeheu, a i kahi wā, ma ka holo wale ‘ana nō o ka mo‘olelo e loa‘a ai i ka uila o ka maka. He mea ho‘omaka‘ala kēia nīnau mua i ka mea heluhelu ma ke ‘ano nui e ao mau a‘e ka nānā ‘ana i kēlā me kēia ‘ike nui o ke au mo‘olelo ma kona ‘ano ho‘omohala kuana‘ike Hawai‘i.
2. He aha nā ‘ao‘ao ‘ike ku‘una i pa‘a e pili ana i ia la‘ana/hāpana mo‘omeheu?
 - E ho‘olōkahi ‘ia he noi‘i ‘ana ma nā hoa hāpana mo‘okalaleo pili o ia mana‘o ku‘una laulā i mea ho‘okūkū, a pēia ho‘i ia noi‘i ‘ana ma nā mo‘olelo ‘ike kahiko o ke au ali‘i ku‘una paha e pa‘a ai he ho‘okūkū pū ‘ana me ka ‘ike kino (mo‘oka‘ao paha vs. mo‘olelo a ka mea ‘ike kino/maka, e la‘a me Malo me ‘ī‘ī mā);⁴ nā hāpana puke mo‘omana‘o a ko loko/waho; nā lola mānaleo; a ma ka hāiki koke, inā he kūpono ke ana pū ‘ana i ka mo‘omeheu o kekahi lāhui Polenesia/Pākīpika o ia ‘ike ho‘okūkū, e nānā ‘ia nō pēlā (he mea waiwai ia ‘ike Pākīpika i mea e pa‘a ai he kuana‘ike laulā kā‘oko‘ā; he mea waiwai pū ka hiki ke hō‘oia i ka Hawai‘i ‘ana o ka ‘ike Hawai‘i).
3. He aha nā lawena like ‘ole e hiki ke kilo ‘ia mai loko mai o ka la‘ana/hāpana mo‘omeheu?
 - E nānā ‘ia ke kūlana ho‘okele me ke kūlana hahai; ke kūlana pilikana me ka pilikāmau; no ka lawena ahuwale me ka lawena ‘ano huna a nalo pe‘e ho‘i; a mea like aku paha. He mea nui nō ho‘i ka lawena a ke kino e ‘i‘o ai ka mihi, e ‘ono ai kahi ‘olelo ho‘ohenehene, a e le‘a ai kahi ‘olelo a hana pelapela.

4. He aha ho'i ka lelikona kā'oko'a e kālailai 'ia e pili ana i ka la'ana/hāpana mo'omeheu?
 - I mea ho'i e ili pono aku ai kēia mau 'ike ke a'o hou 'ia, a ke ha'i'ōlelo hou 'ia paha, me ka ho'opili pū 'ana aku i ke ola nohona o ka mea nona ia a'o, he mea ko'iko'i ka pa'a 'ana i ka 'ike 'ōlelo i mea ho'i e pa'a ai ia 'ike ma ka piha pono o kona 'ano, a launa ke ho'opuka waha hou 'ia. 'O kekahi 'ao'ao mea nui aku o ka ho'opa'a hāiki 'ana i ka 'ike 'ōlelo, 'o ia ka ho'oulu 'ana i ka hiki ke kālailai i ka nane 'ia o ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i, a 'o kahi mea hilu loa, 'o ka hiki ke ho'oulu pono aku i ke kuana'ike Hawai'i ma kona mau 'ao'ao like 'ole a pau i loko ho'i o ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i o kēia au.
5. He aha nā 'ao'ao pili 'uhane o ka pō'aiapili la'ana/hāpana mo'omeheu e kilo 'ia i mea kālailai e ao a'e ai ka waihona na'au?
 - Ma waho aku o nā hi'ohi'ona 'uhane ahuwale, he aha nā 'ao'ao 'ano nalo paha o ka 'uhane e ho'oholo 'ia ai kekahi pō'aiapili, a e ho'okō 'ia ai paha kekahi 'ano pilina kanaka e pili pū ana?

A no laila, he 'oloke'a 'ohi 'ike kēia nāna e ho'omaka'ala aku ana i ka mea noi'i ma luna o nā 'ao'ao like 'ole a pau o kekahi pō'aiapili mo'omeheu e loa'a ma ke au o ka heluhelu 'ana. No'u pono'i iho nō, i mea ho'i kēia 'ano nānā 'ana e ākea a'e ai he kuana'ike no ka nohona Hawai'i ku'una ma ka mea e pono ai 'o ka noho 'ana o kēia au.⁵

No Ka HuALEKIKONA

He mea kēia ha'awina hualekikona e ho'omana'o mai ana i ko ke au hou he mea ko'iko'i ka ho'opuka 'ana i ka 'ōlelo kūpono ma kona kumuhana kūpono ma kona pō'aiapili kūpono. I loko o nā pō'aiapili 'ōlelo o kēia au hou (no ke kumuhana ku'una me ke kumuhana hou nō ho'i), he mea nui ka hiki ke ho'opono ma ka

‘ōlelo kūpono. Inā he ho‘olewa, e lohe ‘ia nā hualekikona e pe‘a ai ka lima i ke kua, e uē hāmama a‘e ai a kania‘ā wale, a kūmākena wale, a na‘au‘auā wale, a ‘ū ho‘i. Inā e pa‘a ka mea ‘ōlelo (a mea kākau paha) ma “kaumaha, kaumaha, kaumaha” wale nō, ‘a‘ohe nō ulu o ka ‘ike, pōkole pū ho‘i ka ulu o ka ‘a‘au e ‘uhane ai ka ‘ōlelo ‘ana.

Pēia pū ma nā pō‘aiapili like ‘ole ‘ē a‘e a pau. Inā he ho‘omana‘o mo‘olelo ku‘una, e lohe ‘ia nā hualekikona o ia pō‘aiapili/wā, e like me nā la‘ana e helu ‘ia ma lalo. Inā he ho‘ohau‘oli ma ka piha makahiki o ke kupuna, e lohe ‘ia nā hualekikona e hapahapai a‘e ana i ke ola o ke kupuna a kolopupū, a haumaka‘iole, a palalauhala, a ka‘ikōkō, a kau i ka puāneane. He mea ko‘iko‘i kēia kuana‘ike hualekikona e ho‘opono ai i ka ‘ōlelo o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana. He kōkua nui ho‘i ia ma ka pālama pono ‘ana i ka ‘ike mai o kikilo mai i loko o kona ‘ōlelo iho nō, a he mea pū ia e piha ai ka na‘auao i mea haku no kēia mua aku, a moku ‘ole ka pilina kupuna o ia ‘ike kupuna i loko o kēia au hou.

Aia ko‘u ‘ike mua ‘ana no ia mana‘o nui, ‘o ka hualekikona, ma ka papa lae‘ula a ke Kauka Pila Wilson (2006). He ha‘awina kā ua Wilson nei i kūkulu ai ma luna o ka ho‘ākāka ‘ana i ka hualekikona ho‘ōla ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i no loko mai o ka hāpana mo‘olelo kahiko. ‘O ia ho‘i, ma ka ‘ao‘ao he kumu a‘o ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i, he aha nā “hualekikona” e maka‘ala ai ke kumu i ha‘awina na ka haumāna: inā paha he hua‘ōlelo e hā‘ule ma‘amau ana kona ‘okina i ka puana ‘ole ‘ia, a e ma‘amau ana paha i loko o ka puana hemahema ‘ia (i.l., “nā kānaka” e hā‘ule ma‘amau ana ke kō o “kānaka”); inā paha he hua‘ōlelo laha ‘ole paha o kekahi pō‘aiapili (i.l., he “unu” i ke alopiko ma kahi o “kaha” i ka ‘ōpū); inā paha he māmala‘ōlelo a ‘ikioma pa‘a nō paha e ho‘opuka ‘ia ai kekahi mana‘o kūmau (i.l., “kū mai a ha‘i ka hua”; “e kū au i ku‘u pule”); inā paha he hō‘oia i ke kino nono‘a pono (i.l., “kou ‘awa” ma kahi o kāu ‘awa).

‘O ia ‘ano ho‘omaka‘ala ‘ana kekahi kumuhana nui a‘u o ke kūkā ‘ana ma ia papa ma ke kilo ‘ana i nā hāpana mo‘olelo kahiko like ‘ole. Pēlā i pa‘a iho ai ko‘u no‘ono‘o nui ma ia mau ha‘awina hualekikona, a ‘ike ihola wau—no ko‘u i‘ini nui e ho‘iho‘i hou i ke kaila kūkulu mana‘o ku‘una i loko o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i o kēia au, a keu ho‘i i loko o ka ha‘i‘ōlelo Hawai‘i—he ha‘awina pono nō ho‘i ia hualekikona e hō‘oia ‘ia ai ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i launa kūpono o kona pō‘aiapili. He mea kēia kuana‘ike hualekikona e pili pono iho ai ma ke kuamo‘o ‘ōlelo ku‘una launa pono o kona ‘ike a mo‘olelo ku‘una iho nō.

I la'ana o ia kuana'ike ho'ohana i ka hualekikona i loko o kekahī 'ōlelo 'ana, inā 'o ka lā'au lapa'au ke kumuhana nui o ka 'ōlelo 'ana, e lohe 'ia nā hualekikona o ia māhele 'ike e pili pū ana (i.l., he "apu," he "papahana," he "kualima," he "pani" nō ho'i); inā he kumuhana ku'una o ke au iā Kamehameha mā, e lohe 'ia nō nā hualekikona e pili pū ana i ia au (he "makua hanauna" ma kahi o 'anakala; he "āha'ilono" ma kahi o waha 'ōlelo; he "aha'ōlelo" ma kahi o "hālāwai"; he "kaumaha mōhai ho'okalahala" ma kahi o "ka hā'awi 'ana i ka makana mihi"). 'A'ole wale nō ho'i ma nā hua'ōlelo pākahikahi ia hualekikona 'ana, ua ahuwale pū nō na'e ke kaila i puka aku ai he hualekikona o ke 'ano māmala'ōlelo (he 'ōlelo no'eau paha, he ho'okā'au 'ana paha, he 'ikioma paha, he analula laha 'ole paha), oki loa ho'i, ke kaila kūkulu mana'o piha nona mai ia 'ano hualekikona. He mea ia ha'awina i kia'i nui ai au i ke kaila 'ōlelo i ho'oholo 'ia na Joseph Moku'ōhai Poepoe paha, na Ho'oulumāhiehie paha, na Samuel Mānaiakalani Kamakau paha, na ia mea kākau aku, ia mea kākau aku i kā lākou mau mo'olelo, a e 'ōkomo 'ia nō ia kaila 'ōlelo i loko o ka ho'omana'o hou 'ana i ia mau mo'olelo. Ke ho'ohui 'ia ia kaila haha'i mo'olelo me ka leo 'ana e lohe 'ia ma waena o nā kūpuna mānaleo, 'o ka ho'omaopopo 'ana i ka hualekikona ke ke'ehina pa'a maika'i e Hawai'i ai ia ho'okā'au 'ana mai ke kumu mai, a pili maika'i i kona kumuhana e ho'oholo 'ia aku ana.⁶

He La'ana Kuhina Hualekikona

'Oiai aia ka hualekikona ma nā wahi a pau o ka 'ōlelo ma ka holo 'ana ho'i o ke au o ka mo'olelo kahiko, eia ma lalo nei he mau la'ana e 'ike ai no ka'u ki'ina wae hualekikona i ha'awina ho'omaka'ala i ka mea heluhelu mo'olelo kahiko. Ma ka la'ana mua, ua kahalalo 'ia nō ho'i nā hualekikona o ia helu 'ana na Kamakau no nā hi'ohi'ona kaua kahiko. He mea wale ia e 'ike ai no ka lilo nō ho'i o kēlā me kēia hualekikona he ha'awina noi'i e na'auao hou a'e ai no ke kaua kahiko, a ke pū'ulu pū ia mau 'ike pākahikahi a pau, 'o ke kā'eo a'e nō ia o ka waihona 'ike, a hua'i wale aku ai nō ho'i i ka wā kūpono o ka 'ōlelo 'ana aku.⁷

Ma ka lua o ka la'ana i ho'olako pū aku ai wau he 'ōlelo wehewehena pōkole e ho'omaopopo iho ai pēlā ma loko o ke kahaapo { }. E ho'omana'o 'ia nō ho'i, inā nō e lilo ia mau la'ana he māhele 'ike e pono ai ka 'ōlelo a ha'i 'ōlelo 'ana paha, he mea ko'iko'i ka mālama 'ana i nā hualekikona o ia pō'aiapili i 'ole ho'i e pau wale ka 'ike ku'una o loko, a hōwai wale iho ia mana'o i ka hua'i hou 'ole 'ia o kona 'ōlelo (hualekikona) e pili pū ana. E ho'omana'o pū 'ia ma ia wae hualekikona 'ana

ka mana'o piha i kūkulu 'ia ai ka la'ana 'ōlelo, a 'oiai he pili kōko'olua pēlā ke kaila 'ōlelo i kona pō'aiapili e waiho iho ana, a inā mau pēlā ke ki'i 'ana i ka 'ōlelo, he hō'oi'a'i'o nui ia i ke 'ano Hawai'i pa'a mau o ka 'ōlelo 'ana aku.

1. No ka mea, ua ho'onohonoho aku 'o Kapi'iohookalani i kona mau ali'i a me kona mau kuhina kaua ma ka hunapa'a, a ma ka hunalewa, a me ka hunalele, 'o ko[na] po'e 'o ia ka māmakakaua pa'a. Ua ho'onoho huinahālike 'ia ke 'ano o ka po'e. 'O nā huna, 'o ia ka ēheu 'ākau, a me ka ēheu hema. 'O [ke] kaua kūkulu, he kaua moemoe ke 'ano, ua hana 'ia a like me ka pua mālolo, he hunalele ka 'ēheu 'ākau a me ka 'ēheu hema o ke kaua moemoe. A mama ihola 'o Kamehameha i ka 'awa, a pau ka hana 'ana, aumiki {**ma kahi o "mūkiki"**} nō ho'i a pau, a kāhe'e {**ma kahi o "ninini"**} nō ho'i i ka apu {**ma kahi o "ki'aha" a "pola" paha**}. Le'ale'a [sic: Lealea] {**ma kahi o "pule"**} nō ho'i i ka 'awa a noa, lālau {**ma kahi o "ki'i**} nō ho'i ka mō'i i ka apu mua, a hā'awi a'ela i ke aikāne {**ma kahi o "hoa pili"**} punahele āna, a pa'a i kona lima, a ho'omaka a'ela nō ho'i e inu, e pa'i {**ma kahi o "hili"**} a'e ana 'o Kekūhaupi'o i ka 'apu 'awa, lele ana i kahi ē {**ma kahi o "a ua hā'ule ka 'awa i lalo**}. Pane akula 'o Kekūhaupi'o, "Hewa ke ali'i, 'a'ole paha i mama kō kaikaina {**ma kahi o "hoahānau"**} i ka ['awa ē] no ke kanaka, nou, no ke ali'i" {**e mālama piha 'ia kēia puana'i ke ho'opuka hou 'ia**}. Peku {**ma kahi o "pa'i" a "lou" paha**} akula nō 'o Kekūhaupi'o iā Kamehameha (Kamakau, 1996, 'a. 71)

No Ka Meiwi

He hupua ka hua‘ōlelo ‘o “meiwi” (mele + iwi): “Traditional elements of Hawaiian poetry, story telling, oratory, and narration” (Kōmike Hua‘ōlelo, 2003, ‘a. 135).⁸ Ho‘ākāka maila ‘o Larry Kimura (kūka‘i ‘ōlelo, Kupulau 2007) no ka meiwi penei: “He lāli‘i iwi Hawai‘i ka meiwi i haku ‘ia ai a pa‘a ke mele Hawai‘i, ka mo‘olelo Hawai‘i, ka ha‘i‘ōlelo Hawai‘i, a mea like ho‘i, a pa‘a ia ma kona ‘ano e ‘ike ‘ia ai he Hawai‘i i ke ‘ano o ka ‘ōlelo me ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i o loko.” Ho‘omana‘o pū ‘ia penei i loko o kā Kimura (2002, ‘a. 2) pepa laeo‘o penei:

‘O ka meiwi (mele + iwi) ka hua‘ōlelo i haku mua ‘ia no ka makemake i hua‘ōlelo mana‘o laulā e ka‘a ai ma lalo ona nā ‘ano ku‘una Hawai‘i laulā i lohe ‘ia ma ke mele, ha‘i mo‘oka‘ao, kākā‘ōlelo a ho‘opāpā paha. Ua haku mua ‘ia no ka ho‘ohana ‘ana ma ka papa haku mele i mea e kilo ‘ia ai ia ‘ike ku‘una....

Ke kilo ‘ia ke ‘ano o ke kino o ke kanaka, e ‘ike ‘ia ka pa‘a o ka ‘i‘o ma luna o ka iwi. Ho‘oku‘i ‘ia nā iwi ma kahi o nā ‘ami e pa‘a ai ko ke kino kinanahiwi. Nui nā ‘ami ho‘oku‘i iwi like ‘ole o ke kinanahiwi ho‘okahi.

Ua like ke mele Hawai‘i ku‘una me ke kino o ke kanaka. Ua hiki ke māhele ‘ia ke mele i loko o ‘elua māhele nui a‘u e kapa nei ‘o ia ke kino ‘i‘o a me ke kino iwi. ‘O ke kino ‘i‘o nō ka ‘ōlelo o ke mele, ka mana‘o ho‘i e kāpili ‘ia mai ai ma luna o ke kino iwi. ‘O ke kino iwi, ‘o ia ka ‘ōnaehana kūkulu e kū ai ke mele he kino pa‘a. E pa‘a ke kino ‘i‘o (ka mana‘o) o ke mele i kona kinanahiwi, ‘o ia ho‘i, kona kino iwi [ka meiwi].

He mea kēia meiwi no kākou o kēia au hou, ‘o ia ho‘i he mea ho‘i ia e ho‘okolo aku ai ka mea noi‘i i nā hi‘ohi‘ona kūkulu mana‘o a nā kūpuna i hua i loko o ke kaila kākau ma ke ‘ano pa‘a mau. I ka wā e ki‘i ai ko kēia au hou e haku hou, hele nō ho‘i a pili ma ia kuamo‘o welo ‘ike meiwi, ‘o ke ala nui ia e mau ai ka pa‘a o ke kaila Hawai‘i, ‘a‘ole e lilo loa i loko o ke kuana‘ike malihini.

‘Oiai he pili pono ko Kimura kākau ‘ana ma luna o nā meiwi e pa‘a ai ke mele Hawai‘i ku‘una, eia ko‘u kākau ‘ana ke ho‘ohua hou aku nei i ia ‘ike ma luna o ka mo‘olelo ku‘una, a e like ho‘i me ko Kimura kilo ‘ana i ka meiwi mele ku‘una i lamakū ho‘omana‘o i ke ‘ano haku mele o kēia au, eia nō ho‘i ko‘u kilo ‘ana i ka meiwi mo‘olelo ku‘una ma ka mea e ho‘omana‘o ‘ia i loko o ka ‘olelo a ha‘i‘olelo ‘ana nō ho‘i. Eia ma lalo nei he kūkā laulā no ko‘u ‘ike mua no ia mea he meiwi ma ka haku mele, a laila, no ko‘u ‘ike hou ‘ana i ia meiwi ma ka mo‘olelo ku‘una. Pau, e helupapa ‘ia nō ia mau meiwi mo‘olelo ku‘una a pau ma ka pākahi me ka ho‘olako pū ‘ana aku he la‘ana no loko pono mai o kekahī hāpana mo‘olelo ku‘una e mōakāka ai.

‘O ko‘u ‘ike mua no kēia kumuhana meiwi, aia ho‘i ia ma ka papa haku mele o ko‘u noho haumāna ‘ana na Kimura nō ma ke kau Kulanui Kupulau o ka MH 1994. ‘Oiai he kilo hāiki nō kā Kimura (2002) pepa laeo‘o i ke “kino iwi” wale nō o ia meiwi ‘ana, he ala ho‘omā‘ike‘ike ia papa haku mele ma nā ‘ike kahua ho‘i o ke “kino iwi” a me ia “kino ‘i‘o” pū kekahī i ka wā ho‘okahi. Ma ka ‘ao‘ao kino iwi o ke mele, kālele ‘ia ke “ku‘inaiwi” (Kimura, 2002, ‘a. 2–7), ‘o ia ho‘i ‘o nā ‘olelo e ku‘i ai kekahī lālani mele a i kekahī aku ma ka like, ka pili, me ka ‘ēko‘a paha o ke kani, ka mana‘o, me ka pilina‘olelo paha (‘a. 10). A laila, ma ke kino ‘i‘o o ia papa haku mele, ua nānā ‘ia “ke kumuhana, ke kaona, ka ‘olelo no‘eau, ka ‘olelo kaulana, ka puana‘i a me ke kūhō‘ailona” o ka mana‘o o nā hua‘olelo (‘a. 2–3). Wehewehe ihola nō ‘o Kimura i ka ‘olelo no‘eau, he “‘olelo pa‘a i ho‘ohana kuluma ‘ia no ka hō‘ike no‘eau ‘ana i kekahī mana‘o, e like me, *He hānai kanaka, hiki ke ho‘ounauna ‘ia. He hānai ali‘i, he ‘ai ahupua‘a*; ‘o ka ‘olelo kaulana, he “‘olelo laha no ka ho‘ohanohano ‘ana i nā ‘ano mea like ‘ole e like me ke kanaka, akua, ‘āina a me ke kai, e like me, *Puna paia ‘ala i ka hala*, no ka ho‘ohanohano ‘ana i ka ‘āina ‘o Puna”; a ‘o ke kūhō‘ailona, ‘o ia “ka mea e kū ana no kekahī mana‘o me ka hō‘ike ‘ole ‘ana i ia mea maoli, e like me, *Ka liko a‘o ka lehua*, no ka wahine u‘i” (‘a. 2–3).

I ke kau Kupulau o ka MH 1999 i komo hou aku ai wau i loko o ka ha‘awina meiwi ma ka papa laeo‘o na ke Kauka Kalena Silva. Ma ia papa nō i ho‘olauna ‘ia ai ka mana‘o e pili ana i ka meiwi i loko o ka mo‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una, ‘o ia ho‘i, e like me ke kāpilipili ‘ana i ke mele a pa‘a he mele Hawai‘i, pēia ho‘i ka mana‘o nui o kēia papa nei e kilo ana i nā meiwi e kāpilipili ‘ia ai ka mo‘olelo ku‘una a pa‘a he mo‘olelo Hawai‘i. I loko ho‘i o ia kilo ‘ana i nā meiwi mo‘okalaleo i kilo pū ‘ia ai ka hana ku‘una o ka mo‘omeheu me ona mau loina e pili pū ana e like me ka mea e mohala a‘e ai he kuana‘ike Hawai‘i laulā.⁹ I loko o ia mua mai i lilo mai ai ka iwi o kēia papa nei—‘o ke kālailai meiwi mo‘okalaleo¹⁰—‘o ia kekahī kahua nui i ‘imi ai au i ka hō‘inana hou ‘ana a‘e i ka ha‘i‘olelo Hawai‘i ku‘una.

Ho'olauna maila ua Silva nei ma ia papa he 'umikumamāhā meiwi mo'okalaleo ma ke kālailai 'ana i ka mo'olelo o Kamapua'a (Kahiolo, 1998). A hala a'ela he wā o ko'u ho'omaumau 'ana i ka heluhelu me ke kālailai mo'olelo ku'una, ua 'upu a'ela i loko o'u he 'ewalu hou a'e meiwi a'u i ho'ohui ai i loko o ia pū'ulu meiwi mua. Kūkulu hou a'ela wau i ia papa helu ma ka mea e kūpono ana i ka'u noi'i hou 'ana aku. 'A'ohe nō ka'ina 'o'ole'a ma waho aku o ka helu 'ana i kēlā me kēia meiwi e like me ka mea i a'o 'ia ai wau, a laila aku ka'u pāku'i pū 'ana i ka'u mau meiwi wae hou aku.

'Ikioma / 'Ōlelo No'eau / Ho'okā'au / Nane / (Kaona)

Ma kēia ho'i 'ana a Ke'elehā mai Mānā aku, 'a'ole 'o ia i kipa a'e i ko Kamalama mā wahi. Ua kulu loa maila nō ka hulu o ka pi'i, no ka mea, aia 'o Kawelowai i loko o kona waihona no'ono'o, kahi i lapakū ai i kaua [mea] 'o ka makemake i ke kaikamahine a 'Aikanaka. Na wai e 'ole ka makemake, he i'a kā ho'i ua lou mua i ka malo'o. 'A'ole kā ho'i i pulu ka 'ili i ke kai, pa'a 'ē nō i ka makau a Ka'elehā. (Ho'oulu māhiehieika'oni mālieapua līlialanaikawai, 2009, 'a. 361)

He ahuwale ho'i ka mana'o o kēia meiwi nei, 'o ia ho'i, ke 'ano o ka no'eau o ka 'ōlelo e ho'ohana 'ia i loko o ka mo'olelo o ke kaila 'ikioma me ka 'ōlelo no'eau. He mea ka 'ōlelo no'eau o ke 'ano kuluma, a he 'ōlelo haku paha o ia kaila kuluma e pili ana ma ke kaila "ho'ohanohano," e like me kā Kimura (2002, 'a. 2-3) i kūkā 'ia ma luna ma nā 'ōlelo ho'olauna i kēia māhele 3 nei. 'O ka ho'okā'au 'ana ke 'ano akamai o ke kāpilipili 'ana i ka 'ōlelo i loko o ke kuana'ike Hawai'i; 'o ke 'ano "pā'ani" ho'i ma ka 'ōlelo me ke akamai nui e āhē ai ka na'au. A laila aku ka 'ōlelo kaila nane i ahuwale a'e kona 'ike 'ia i waena o kānaka.¹⁹ Ua ho'opa'a 'ia ke "(Kaona)" ma ke kahaapo ma luna no kona 'ano kū ka'awale 'ole, 'o ia ho'i, he hua mana'o ke kaona no loko mai o kona 'ōlelo i ho'okā'au 'ia ai me ka lolo nui. He mana'olau nō ho'i ia e puka mai ana mai loko mai o ka pō'aiapili nona ka no'eau o ka 'ōlelo.²⁰ He mea nui ka 'ike 'ana i ia mau poke 'ōlelo maoli a ka mānaleo (ma ke kākau me ka 'ōlelo waha pū), kohu mea he 'ano 'ōlelo pāku'i hou aku ma luna o ka mea e a'o pilina'ōlelo 'ia ma ka lumi papa. He 'ano lawena nō ho'i ia o ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i 'ana e kohu pili iho ai.

Ho'okalakupua

He meiwi loa'a wale ia ho'okalakupua ma nā mo'olelo o ke 'ano ka'ao nō ho'i. He mea ia ho'okalakupua 'ana e 'ike 'ia ai ke 'ano hana kupua: 'o ka hele 'ana ho'i a ma 'ō aku o ka hana ma'amau a ke kanaka. 'A'ole anei pēlā i ho'āno 'ia ai ke ali'i i ke au kahiko? Ma ia 'ano kuana'ike, he mea komo ho'i ka ho'okalakupua ma nā mo'olelo a pau, keu ho'i ma kēia 'ohina wae la'ana e ho'ohana 'ia nei, e like ho'i me ko Kawelo 'ano 'ai 'ana (Ho'oulu māhiehieika'oni mālieapua līlialanaikawai, 2009, 'a. 59-60); e like ho'i me ke kahuli 'ana o Naha Pōhaku iā Kamehameha,

ke "kuahiwi maoli" ho'i i noa i nā ali'i Naha wale nō (Hoolumahiehie, *Ka Na'i Aupuni*, Kekemapa 28–29, 1905); a pēia pū ho'i me ko Kaluaiko'olau 'āha'i loa 'ana i loko o nā pali o Kalalau mā e hō'alo 'ia ai nā koa P.G. e ho'ouna 'ia ai i Kalaupapa (Kelekona & Kaluaikoolau, 1906). I loko ho'i o kēia kuana'ike, a 'oiai he mea ma'alahi wale nō ka 'ohi 'ana i nā la'ana o ke 'ano kupua maoli, e la'a me Kamapua'a mā, e 'ohi 'ia kauwahi la'ana "pili kanaka" ho'i o ia ho'okalakupua 'ana e ho'opili 'ia ai ia meiwi ma kekahi 'ano 'oia'i'o o ke kanaka Hawai'i 'ana, 'a'ole he mea ho'ohau'oli ho'omoemoeā wale a'e nō.

Ma ka huaka'i 'imi wahine a ke Ali'i 'Aiwohikupua iā Lā'ieikawai, pae akula nā wa'a i Kauhola, Hawai'i Mokupuni, i ka lehulehu 'ana o ka 'aha mokomoko; 'o Ihuanu ko laila moho nui. A pau a'e nā kūka'i 'ōlelo e 'a'a aku ana, 'a'a mai ana, hui ihola ia mau mea 'elua o ka mokomoko 'ana, a eo ho'i ka lanakila nui iā 'Aiwohikupua i ka lua 'ole o kona ikaika penei:

A pau kā lāua kama'ilio 'ana, nīnau hou akula 'o 'Aiwohikupua iā Ihuanu, "Ua mākaukau anei 'oe e ku'i mai ia'u? Inā he mana'o e ku'i, ku'i mai i ku'u maka." I ia manawa, e waiho koke mai ana 'o Ihuanu i ka pu'upu'u, hū ka makani ma ka pāpālina o 'Aiwohikupua, 'a'ole na'e i kū, no ka mea, ua 'alo 'o 'Aiwohikupua, 'o ia ka mea i hala ai.

A hala ka pu'upu'u a Ihuanu, e waiho koke a'e ana 'o 'Aiwohikupua i kāna pu'upu'u, kū nō i ka houpo, hulā ma ke kua. I ia manawa, ka'ika'i a'ela 'o 'Aiwohikupua i ke kanaka me kona lima, a koali a'ela iā Ihuanu i mua o ke anaina, a kiola akula i waho o ka 'aha a lanakila ihola 'o 'Aiwohikupua ma luna o Ihuanu. 'Uā'uā akula ka pihe me ka hui o ka 'aha i ka po'e māka'ika'i. (Hale'ole, 2001, 'a. 31)

Ma mua o ka ukomo pū ‘ana o Pāka‘a ma ka huaka‘i ka‘apuni a ke Ali‘i Pai‘ea a puni nā moku, a‘oa‘o iholo ko Pāka‘a makuahine, ‘o La‘amaomao, i ke keiki penei:

Ke haawi aku nei au i keia ipu ia oe, a ko kupunawahine
eepa keia nona mai ko‘u inoa, a eia iloko nei kona mau iwi.
I kona wa e ola ana, ua lilo na makani a pau o keia pae aina
i kauwa nana, a malalo o kekahi mana kupaignaha i loaa
iaia, ua hoiliili mai oia i na makani a pau iloko o ua ipu nei,
a ke mau nei ka paa oia mau makani iloko o keia ipu a hiki
i keia wa....

E malama loa oe i keia ipu, oiai, he ipu kauoha keia mai na
kupuna mai, a o ka waiwai nui o keia ipu, aole oe e ike i keia
wa, aka, aia aku a hele aku oe me ke alii a hiki i kahi e malie
ai, a la‘iku, a pohu, a pau ke aniani ana mai a ka makani,
alaila...e hoaiki ae no oe i ke po‘i o ka ipu a kahea aku i ka
makani, a o ka pa mai no ia o ka makani a holo na waa o
oukou a pae i ka aina. (Nakuina, 1902a, ‘a. 20–21)

‘Ēko‘a

He mea kēia meiwi e hō‘ike ana i kekahī mana‘o nui kā‘oko‘a i loko o kona mau
māhele ‘ēko‘a. Inā he “lani ko luna” a he “honua ko lalo,” ‘o ka pau pū no ia o ka
‘ike me ke kama‘aina no nā mea a pau a puni ia wahi. Inā paha hā‘awi ‘ia ‘o uka,
hā‘awi ‘ia ‘o kai, pau pū nō nā ‘aina a pau mai uka a i kai. Inā paha hea ‘ia ke “akua
nui” me ke “akua iki,” hea ‘ia nō nā akua a pau, e like ho‘i me ia hea ma‘amau ‘ana
i nā ‘aumākua i ka pō me nā ‘aumākua i ke ao, ‘o nā ‘aumākua a pau loa ia o ke ao
‘uhane, ka mea i hānau kanaka ‘ole mai me ka mea i hānau kanaka mai a kākū‘ai
‘ia ho‘i ma ka pau ‘ana. Komo ho‘i i loko o kā Kamehameha kānāwai ke kanaka nui
me ke kanaka iki e mālama ‘ia ai nā kānaka a pau, he aha lā kona kūlana me ka ‘ole,
he aha lā kona waiwai me ka ‘ole. Eia ma lalo nei he ‘elua ho‘i la‘ana e ahuwale ana
ia ‘ēko‘a me kona mana‘o pili penei.²¹ (I la‘ana ikaika hou aku no ia meiwi ‘ēko‘a,
e nānā i ke au ‘ana o ka ho‘opāpā ma ka mo‘olelo o Kalapana [Nakuina, 1902e].)

- A i ka pii ana ae o ko Pakaa nui, ua pii pu ae me kona kanaka u'i, a ua pii pu ae hoi me kona ike, akamai a me ka maiau i na hana a pau o ke aloalii o Keawenuiaumi; ua pau iaia na loinā o ka lani a me na ano o ka honua, oia hoi ka mahiai ana a me na mea a pau e pili ana ilaila, ke kilo hoku a me ka holo moana ana, ka hookele waa, ka noho ana o uka nei o ka aina, ka lawai'a a me na ano hana e ae no a pau. (Nakuina, 1902a, 'a. 27)
- 'Auhea 'oe, e Kamalama, a me kou po'e nei nō ho'i a pau. I mea e 'eha 'ole ai 'o ka 'ili ou, e Kamalama, a me ou mau kānaka a'u e 'ike aku nei, e aho ko 'oukou ho'i hou 'ana i O'ahu. 'A'ole kēia 'o nā wa'a e ki'i mai ai e kaua iā Kaua'i nei. A inā 'o kāu ki'i 'ana mai nei e kaua iā Kaua'i nei a he wa'a nui, he wa'a iki, he wa'a loa a he wa'a pokō, a laila, waiwai ka 'au 'ana mai nei ou, e Kamalama, me ou po'e kānaka i kēia kai. (Ho'oulu māhiehieika'oni mālieapua lila lanaikawai, 2009, 'a. 301)

Kīkahō

'Oiai he 'ao'ao waiwai ko nā mea a pau e komo aku ana i loko o ke au mo'olelo, he mea ia meiwi kīkahō o ka ho'okomo 'ana o ka mea kākau i kona mau mana'o pono'i iho nō i loko o ka mo'olelo, a i ka nui aku o ka manawa, inā nō wehe 'ia ia kīkahō 'ana, 'a'ole nō pilikia ke au mo'olelo pono'i iho nō (he "kīkahō kūkahekahe"). I kekahi manawa na'e, he kōkua nui ia kīkahō 'ana ma ka mea e wehewehe 'ia ai kekahi hana i ho'oholo 'ia ma ka mo'olelo, a i 'ole paha he mea ia kīkahō 'ana e wehewehe ana i kekahi mau mana'o pili i ka pō'aiapili o ka mo'olelo (he "kīkahō kōkua"). I kekahi manawa aku ho'i, komo ho'i paha ke kīkahō a ka mea kākau me ka māka 'ole aku pēlā, e like ho'i me ka mea e mahu'i 'ia nei ma ka mo'olelo no Ka'ehuikimanōopu'uloa na Uaua (*Ke Au Okoa*, Kekemapa 22, 1870), ma kona kūkahekahe 'ana no nā mokupuni o Nu'uhiwa Pae'āina i huaka'i ai 'o Ka'ehuikimanōopu'uloa mā, a komo akula i loko o Tahiti mā, a komo akula i loko o Nūhōlani mā (i kapa 'ia e ia mea kākau 'o Nu'umealani ho'i ia 'āina). Mali'a penei ma muli o ka 'ike maka 'ana o ua Uaua nei i ia mau 'āina ma kona kūlana he kela moku paha, a ho'oholo 'ia ai ia 'ike keu pēlā, a i 'ole paha he mea ia 'ike i ili ma luna o ka mea kākau a ho'oili akula i loko o ka mo'olelo ma ka mea e ahuwale ai ko ka mea kākau 'ike nui no ia mau 'āina malihini. He kuhi wale nō na'e kēia na'u, 'oiai 'a'ole nō i ho'ākāka mai 'o Uaua penei ma kona kākau 'ana. (He mea

paha ia e ho'okolo 'ia i loko o kekahi mana aku o ua mo'olelo nei i loko o ka nūpepa 'o *Ke Au Hou*, 1910–1911.) Ma lalo nei e hō'ike 'ia ai he la'ana kikahō kūkahekahe a kōkua hou aku penei.

Kūkahekahe akula 'o Kawa (*Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Ianuali 29, 1887) ma ka mo'olelo no ke Ali'i Lonoikamakahiki ma ka 'ōkomo 'ana i kona mau mana'o ho'okae iho nō e pili ana i ke au mo'olelo penei:

Ua kaapuni ia e ke alii [Lonoikamakahiki] o Hawaii a puni, a penei kekahi hana a ke alii: Ua hele oia me na koa, a hiki lakou ma kekahi mau ahupuaa, a o na kanaka o ke Ahupuaa i ike ole mai i ke alii oia hoi, aohe he lawe mai i ka ai, ka ia, ka puua, a me na mea e hoomoamoa mai ai na ke alii, e like me ka mea maamau i keia Lahuikanaka; alaila, e kauoha aku no ke alii i kona mau koa e kii e hao i na mea a na makaainana e laa hoi ka puua, a e oki ia ka pepeiao o ka puua na ke alii ia puua, a pela no hoi me ka loi-kalo, ina e hou ia i ka welau ko alaila ua lilo na ke alii ia loi-kalo, a pela aku na hana o ia au kahiko o Hawaii nei.

Ua lilo kou pono Kivila i mea ole, a he nui ka pilikia o na makaainana ia manawa. Aka, ua auhee aku ia mau hana o ia au kahiko, aole e ike hou ia ia mau hana o ke au poeleele o ia noho ana imua o keia lahuikanaka e noho nei i keia au malamalama, a hiki i ka hulihia ana o ke ao nei.

A oia ka ka mea kakau moolelo e puana ae nei, "Ua aie keia lahuikanaka i ka lokomaikai o na Makua Misionari, o ka poe i hele mai me ka hoomanawanui i ke ao ana i ka malamalama o ka olelo a ke Akua iwaena o keia lahuikanaka, a me ko lakou mau alii." Oiai ua hala kahiko aku la ke au o ko ke alii Lonoikamakahiki noho aupuni ana a me kona lahuikanaka, a me na hana o ia manawa.

A hiki mai i ka wa i ai noa ai na 'lii a me na makaainana o keia Pae Aina; oia hoi ke kaua i Kuamoo nei, a ke 'lii Kekuaokalani a me Liholiho. Ua wehe mua ke Akua i ka ipuka o Hawaii nei kahi e komo mai ai kana olelo i

hoauhee ia aku ka pouli o keia noho lahuikanaka ana. A ina paha i hiki mua mai ka olelo a ke Akua i ke au o ko Lonoikamakahiki noho aupuni ana, ina la aole e pilikia ka noho'na lahui o ia au.

E ka mea heluhelu, e aui ae kaua e nana i ke alii ia Lonoikamakahiki.

Kōkua maila ‘o Ho'ouluumāhiekieka‘onimālieapualilialanaikawai (2009, ‘a. 99) no ia mea he “ninini huewai nuku loa” i ‘imi ai ‘o Kaweloleimakua e ho‘okūkū aku lāua me kona hoahānau ‘o Kauahoa ma ia hana kamali‘i he ho‘okahekahe wai penei:

E ka makamaka heluhelu, e kala mai ‘oe i kou mea kākau mo‘olelo ma ka hō‘ike ‘ana aku iā ‘oe no ke ‘ano o kēia ho‘okahekahe wai a Kaweloleimakua e koi nei iā Kauahoa. Eia ke ‘ano o kēia: ‘o ka wai o ka huewai nuku loa a kahi, a pēlā nō ho‘i kā kahi o lāua, ‘o ia ka wai a Kawelo i makemake ai e ho‘okūkū lāua. Ke ‘ike ihola paha ‘oe, e ka makamaka a hoa aloha heluhelu, i ka mana‘o o nei ‘ōlelo. ‘A‘ole ‘o ka wai ‘auwai a kahawai kā Kawelo i mana‘o ai ma nei hana. He hana ma‘amau nō kēia i nā keiki o Hawai‘i nei i ke au kahiko. Ua kapa ‘ia kēia hana e nā po‘e kahiko, “ka ninini huewai nuku loa,” a ‘o kahi hailona kēia o ia au e ‘ike ‘ia ai ke aho loa a me ke aho pokō o nā keiki a nā ali‘i.²²

Kuhia / Puana‘ī

He meiwi ho‘i kēia e ha‘akuhi ai ka mea kākau i ka ‘ike ho‘opihapiha paha no waho mai (kuhia), a he ‘ōlelo a mele paha (puana‘ī) ma ke ‘ano e ho‘oholo ai i kona māhele mo‘olelo e pili pū ana, ‘a‘ole ho‘i ma ke ‘ano he ‘ōlelo komo wale a ho‘ohiala‘ai paha. (Ma nā mana‘o nui, he loa‘a nō paha ke kaulapa ma waena o ke kikahō kōkua me kēia kuhia/puana‘ī ‘ana.) E kau nui ana ka ho‘omana‘o iā Ho'ouluumāhiekie, i kāna mau mo‘olelo kākau ‘o “He Moolelo no Kamehameha I” (1905–1906), a pēia ho‘i i kā J. M. Poepoe “Ka Moolelo Hawaii Kahiko” (1906).²³ He mea ma‘amau nō ho‘i ma ia mau kaila kākau, ‘o ka ha‘akuhi ‘ana aku iā ha‘i no

kēlā ‘ike kēia ‘ike, e like ho‘i me ka mea i pa‘a mua iā ia iho nō, a ma ka mea nō paha e ho‘okūkū ‘ia ai he ‘elua mana ‘ike kekahī me kekahī aku. Eia ma lalo nei kauwahi la‘ana mai kā lāua nei mau mo‘olelo mai nō e ‘ike ‘ia ai ia kuhī ‘ana penei.

- Ano e ka makamaka heluhelu, e ae mai oe e hoike aku ka mea kakau moolelo ma keia wahi i keia manao penei:

Ke olelo nei ka mea nana i hoolawa mai i kou mea kakau nei i na mahelehele i hoike ia ae la, o Keawemauhili ka mea nana kela olelo kaulana: “E ou i ka maka o ka wauke oi opio opio.”

A wahi a ua mea nei nana i hoomaikeike mai i keia mau mahelehele i ka mea kakau, o ka wa a Keawemauhili i hoopuka ai i keia mau olelo, ma ka wa no ia a Naeole i hoihoi aku ai ia Kamehameha i ka piha ana o kona mau makahiki i ka elima a eono paha. A ua hoopuka ae o Keawemauhili i keia mau olelo no kona ike ana mai i ke kulana ame na ouli o Kamehameha ia wa, e hoike ana he koa a he hiapairole aku ana oia no Hawaii nei.

Ua olelo hoi kekahī poe na Kalaniopuu no keia mau olelo, a o ka kekahī poe hoi na ke kahuna na Hoolaea [Holoae?].
(Hoolumahiehie, *Ka Na‘i Aupuni*, Kekemapa 25, 1905)

- Ua manaoia o ka mookuauhau Kumulipo, oia ka oi loa aku o ke kahiko mawaena o na mookuauhau apau o Hawaii nei, a ua poholo pu iloko ona na hookumu ha‘i-kupuna ana o loko o kekahī mau mookuauhau e ae.

O keia ka mookuauhau o Hawaii nei i hoomaopopo mai no ka hana a kalai lima ole ia ana o ka honua e ke kanaka; a, aole nohoi i hanauia mai e ka wahine; aka, ua kumu a ua mole kona kahua iloko o ka po, a mai laila oia i ulu mai ai.

O keia manao ka Davida Malo i haawi i ka mahalo, elike me ia i ikeia maloko o kana “Moolelo Hawaii,” i unuhia ma ka Olelo Beretania i keia wa a i kapaia hoi “Hawaiian Antiquities.” Ua oleloia penei: “Malia paha o keia ka manao pololei; a ua ulu io mai no keia mau pae aina no lakou ponoi ae no, a mahope mai i ikeia ai na kanaka maluna o lakou. Malia paha, o ka manao hoakaka maikai loa keia no na manao kuhihewa o ka poe kahiko.” (Haw‘n Atiq., mok. 2, pauku 8.)

Aole hoi elike me ka Rev. F. J. Pokuea i olelo ai ma ka "Moolelo Hawaii" i hooponopono ai a i pa'iia ai ma ka M. H. 1858, ma Honolulu nei, e owili ana i ka manao o ka mookauahau Kumulipo, no ka ulu ana mai o ka aina, me ka hanau ole ia ana e ka wahine, a hana ole ia ana hoi e ka lima o ke kanaka, iloko o na manao hoike o na mookauahau mua ae nei, ma ke ano he manao lapuwale a kuhihewa. (Poepoe, *Ka Na'i Aupuni*, Pepeluali 7, 1906)

Eia hou ma lalo nei he mau la'ana hou aku o nā mo'olelo like 'ole. Hō'ike maila 'o Manu (*Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Kepakemapa 20, 1884) no ka puana'i a ka Mō'i Kalākaua penei:

Ho'omana'o maila 'o Kawa (*Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Mei 21, 1887) i ke mele kāhea a nā kūpuna penei:

I ka wa a Lonoikamakahiki i ike mai ai ia Kekuapania [sic: Kekuapanio] i ka hele aku imua ona, hea mai la oia me ka leo ohaoha o ke aloha ia Kekuapanio, he mai, nolaila hoopau ae la o Kekuapanio i kona makau no ke alii o Hawaii, a hui ae la laua me ke aloha oiaio me ka oluolu loa, oia ka kou mea kakau i hoomanao ae ai i na hooheno a ka poe kahiko, e pili ana i ke kahea ana aku a ke alii o Hawaii ia Kekuapanio,

Ho'olauna / Pani

E like me ke po'omana'o e kau a'ela, he mea kēia meiwi e ho'olauna ai a e pani ai ka mea kākau ma kona mau mana'o iho nō i mea pāku'i i ka mo'olelo, e like ho'i me kā Nākuina (1902a) leka ho'olauna i komo ho'i kona mau mana'o nui 'ehā e kūpa'a ai ka lāhui Hawai'i ma ka makamae 'ana i ka 'ike ku'una o ke au i hala penei:

Ua olelo kekahī poe he kaao wale no keia a aohe waiwai; he kuhihewa ia, no ka mea, he nui ka waiwai o keia moolelo. Akahi, ua kakauia ma ka olelo Hawaii oiaio maoli o ke au kahiko. Alua, o na mele, na pa-ha a me na kau i nalowale kekahī a e nalowale aku ana, aole loa ia e loaa hou ina aole e pa'i buke ia. Akolu, ka inoa o na makani o kela a me keia mokupuni o ko Hawaii Paeaina, a Teritore o Hawaii i keia wa. Aha, o ka mea i oi ae mamua o na kumu mua ekolu i ha'i mua ia ae nei oia ke Aloha Alii oiaio o na kanaka Hawaii i ke au i hala a hiki loa mai no i keia au.

E pani pū ana ho'i ka mea kākau i kona mau mana'o aloha ma mua o ka "sila" 'ana a pa'a pono nā hipu'upu'u a pau o ka ho'oholo mo'olelo 'ana. I kahi wā, he wahi hopuna'olelo ia ho'olauna/pani e aloha wale aku ana i ka mea heluhelu (e nānā i kā Kahilo ma lalo). I kahi wā, he hō'ike piha ia ho'olauna/pani ma nā mana'o hāiki pākahikahi o kēlā 'ano kēia 'ano, a hiki i ka hō'ike 'ana i ke kumu o ia kākau mo'olelo 'ana, a pēia ho'i ka hō'ike 'ana no kekahī mo'olelo e ho'oholo 'ia ma ia hope mai, e like me kā Ho'oulu māhiehieika' onimālieapualilialanaikawai ma lalo.²⁴

E 'ike 'ia ho'i ma kā Kahiolo (1998, 'a. 1) ho'olauna o lalo nei kona ho'omana'o 'ana i ka 'ao'ao kanaka i loko o ka hana ho'opa'a mo'olelo penei:

Ma ka mo'okū'auhau no Kamapua'a a loa'a mai 'o ia, 'o ia kēia e hō'ike 'ia aku nei i mea e 'ike 'ia ai kona 'ano kupanaha a me kona ikaika ma ke kaua 'ana a me ke 'ano 'ē o kona kino a me kāna mau hana. 'O kēia kanaka, ua ho'omana 'ia nō i akua e ko Hawai'i nei po'e, akā, 'a'ole o'u mana'olana ua kūlike loa ka po'e kū'auhau a pau e noho mai nei. 'A'ole nō ho'i akāka ka mea pololei loa no ka mea 'a'ole ho'okahi o lākou mea e ola ana i 'ike i nā mea i hana 'ia i ia wā. 'A'ole nō ho'i o lākou mea i kākau puke mo'okū'auhau nāna a waiho mai na kāna mau pua no ka mea he pono pa'ana'au wale nō a nalowale iho.

Pani ana 'o Kahiolo (1998, 'a. 83) penei:

Ua pau. Pīpī holoholo ka'ao. Ke ho'i nei ko Kalihī keiki, me ke aloha.

—G. W. Kahiolo (Kalihī, O'ahu, Sept 20, 1861)

Ma ke 'ano ohohia nui 'ia, ho'olauna ihola 'o Kahoewa'a (*Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Ianuali 14, 1882) iā "He Moolelo Kaao no Keaniniulaokalani!" ma ka hea 'aumākua i kōkua penei:

Ma ka ho‘olauna ‘ana o Ho‘oulu māhiehieika‘onimālieapua lili lanaikawai (2009, ‘a. 40) iā ”Ka Mo‘olelo Hiwahiwa o Kawelo,” hō‘ike pololei ‘o ia no ka ho‘oponopono ‘ana i ka hemahema puka mua penei:

Ke hā‘awi mua aku nei ka mea kākau o kēia mo‘olelo i kona aloha makahiki hou i nā makamaka a me nā hoa aloha o “Ka Hiwahiwa A Ka Lāhui” ma mua o kona waiho ‘ana aku i mua o lākou he mau ‘olelo ho‘ākāka pōkole no ka mea e pili ana i kēia mo‘olelo.

E ho‘oponopono ana ka mea kākau i ke kū‘auhau pili i nā Kawelo i ‘ike ‘ia he po‘e mō‘ī a he po‘e ali‘i no Kaua‘i, a ma ia ‘ano e ho‘opau ‘ia ai kekahī mau kuhihewa i komo ma ka mo‘olelo mua o Kawelo i ho‘opuka ‘ia ai e Mr. S. N. Hale‘ole [sic] ma loko o ka nūpepa [‘o] Ka Hōkū O Ka Pākipika i kūpono ai i ke kū‘auhau ‘oia‘i‘o o ua po‘e Kawelo nei e like me nā mea i loa‘a i ka mea kākau ma loko o nā mo‘okū‘auhau ali‘i o Kaua‘i.

E komo ana ma kēia ho‘okā‘au hou ‘ana o nei mo‘olelo kaulana o Kawelo he māhele hou, ‘o ia ke kaikua‘ana ‘iole o Kawelo a me Kamalama, a pēlā nō ho‘i me kekahī mau māhele ‘ano nui ‘ē a‘e e mikolololehua ai ka ho‘onu‘u ‘ana iho o ka mo‘olelo, ‘o ia nō ‘oe ‘o ka paukū waena o ua ‘anae i hele a palakahē ka ‘ai o Maka‘ūkiu i kaua mea ‘o ka nui o ka momona.

Pani ‘ia ihola ua mo‘olelo Kawelo nei ma ka ho‘omaopopo ‘ana no ka puka auane‘i o ka mo‘olelo hou penei:

E ka makamaka heluhelu o ka mo‘olelo o Kawelo, e kala mai i ka māka sila o ka mea kākau nei, ‘oiai, ua hiki maila kākou i ka hopena o kēia mo‘olelo kaulana o Kawelo, a ke noi aku nei i kou ‘olu‘olu e lawe aku i ka‘u mau ho‘omaika‘i palena ‘ole i ka po‘e heluhelu o ke Kū‘oko‘a Home Rula [sic], a e aloha auane‘i kākou a pau.

A i kēia puka hou ‘ana aku o kā kākou Hiwahiwa nei ma kēia pule a‘e e ho‘opuka aku ai mākou i kekahī mo‘olelo i loa‘a ‘ole i nā loea haku mo‘olelo o kēia au e ne‘e nei; ‘a‘ole nō ho‘i i ho‘opuka ‘ia kēia mo‘olelo i loko o nā nūpepa kahiko

o kākou i ke au i hala aku. ‘O kēia mo‘olelo kā mākou e pani ana ma kahi o Kawelo i pau a‘ela. He mo‘olelo Hawai‘i nō kēia, ‘o ia ho‘i, ka mo‘olelo o Kuailii [Kū‘aiali‘i], ka lua ‘ole o ke kanaka u‘i o ka papa lohi o ‘Āpua, i “Puna paia ‘ala i ka hala me ka lehua.” (Ho‘oulu māhīehīeika‘onimālieapualilial anaikawai, 2009, ‘a. 412–413)

Hopena

He meiwi ho‘i kēia e ‘ike ‘ia ai ke koe ‘ana mai o kekahi mea o ke au kahiko mai “a hiki i kēia lā” o ke au ho‘i o ka mea kākau e ho‘oholo aku ana i ka mo‘olelo. I ka nui o ka manawa, komo nō ka ‘olelo ‘o “a hiki i kēia lā” i loko penei. Ma ka pau ‘ana o ke ka‘ao no Kana me Niheu (Fornander, 1917, Vol. 4, ‘a. 449), hō‘ike ‘ia no ka ‘āina waiho mai o Waikolu penei:

A pau ka olelo ana a Uli ia Kana, ala mai la o Kana a kupono, a kiei maluna o Haupu, hoaa [*sic: loaa*] iho la i na maka, ala ae la o Haupu a oni, i luna, lalau iho la o Kana i na hui a hhahai. Ma keia hai ana o na hui, ua pau ka mana o Haupu, ua keehi iho la o Kana i ka puu a helelei, a ku kekahi mau puu liilii i loko o ke kai, o ia kela mau puu loulu e ku la ma ka waha o Waikolu, a hiki i keia la. Ma keia make ana o Haupu, ua pio ke ‘lii o Kapeepeakauila, a ua loaa o Hina, a lawe ia mai la a noho me kana kane o Hakalanileo, a pela i pau ai ke kaua ana o Kana me ka puu o Haupu.

I loko o ke kūkā ‘ana no Pehu—ka manō ‘ai kanaka o Honokōhau, Maui, i hālāwai pū me Ka‘ehuikimanōopu‘uloa mā ma ka nalu ha‘i o Kalehuawehe, Waikīki, a pau ihola ‘o Pehu i ka pepehi ‘ia no kona ‘ano hana ‘ino i kānaka—penei ke pani ‘ana o Uaua (*Ke Au Okoa*, Ianuali 5, 1871) o ia māhele mo‘olelo penei:

He nui ko lakou [kānaka] makau a pau nui i ke auhee i uka, a ua ike nae ka nui o na kanaka i ka nui o na mano nana i kipaku a make ai kela mano e kukulu ia moolelo, a make aku la ua mano nei, a okioki ia kona kino, ua loaa iloko ona ka lauoho kanaka a me ka iwi ka pulima kanaka, a pupuhi ia kona kino i ke ahi a lilo i lehu, a ma kahi o kona kino i puhi ia ai i ke ahi, ua kapaia ia wahi (*Ka puhina o Pehu*) aia ma ka pahale o J. Piikoi malalo aku o Peleula, a hiki i keia la, aole paha he poe e ola nei i keia wa i ike ia wahi i puhiia ai ua mano la malalo aku oia pahale o J. Piikoi ma Peleula.

Hō'ike maila 'o Manu (*Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Pepeluali 14, 1885) no ka po'e Menehune a me ka po'e Nāmū Nāwā o ka hālāwai pū 'ana, me ka waiho wale 'ia o ka wa'a o nā Nāmū Nāwā ma kahi o ko lākou hālāwai pū 'ana a hiki i kēia lā penei:

I ka wa i lana ai na waa ma ka wai o Kikihale, oiai o Kahanaiakeakua a me kona mau hoa hele e kau ana iluna o ua mau waa nei, ua huli hoi mai la ua poe menehune nei a hiki ma Kaopuana [*sic*], lohe hou mai la lakou i ka uwa o ka pihe a haalele wale, no keia mea, ua wikiwiki mai la lakou nei a hiki ma Waikalalulu, halawai mai la lakou me ka poe Namu Nawa ma e hapai mai ana i ka lakou waa, aka, i ko lakou halawai ana mai nae me ka poe menehune, ua hai aku la lakou i ua poe Namu Nawa nei, ua hala ke alii me na waa kaulua, a no keia mea ua waihoia keia waa malaila a hiki i keia la, ua pau loa i ka popopo ka nui a ua laweia kekahī mau apana o ua waa nei; aia ma hope iho o ka hale noho o A. F. Judd, ma Kaalaa, alanui Nuuanu, e ninau ia Kahiwalani k. e noho la malaila, na lakou e kuhikuhi mai i ka poe e hele ana e ike maka i ua waa la e waiho nei; a ua kapaia ka inoa o ua waa la, "O ka waa a ke kupua," oia na kuhikuhi ana o keia moolelo, elike me na inoa o na aina i hoikeia [ma] keia moolelo mai Hawaii a Kauai, he mau mea oiaio wale no.

Ku'i

He meiwi ho‘i kēia e ku‘i ai ka mea kākau i kekahī māhele mo‘olelo me kekahī aku. He mea ia ku‘i ‘ana e ukomo aku ai ka mea kākau i kekahī ‘ano ho‘ākāka ‘ana, a i ‘ole paha he mea ia ku‘i ‘ana e ho‘omoe ai i ke kūkā ‘ana no kekahī hana a hāme‘e paha, e huli ai ke au o ka mo‘olelo e kālele aku ana ma luna o kekahī hana a hāme‘e hou aku penei.

- Kaulanaikipokii, ko lakou muli loa, ua ike ia i na uhane o na kaikunane i ke ku aku, aohe poo, elima kino, aole na poo, nolaila uwe ia a holoholo i loko o ka hale.

E olelo iki kakou no Kaulanaikipokii. He wahine mana o Kaulanaikipokii, he ike; o ia mana a hiki i keia la, a ke lilo nei oia i kumu lapaau, a haha paaoao. (Fornander, 1917, Vol. 4, ‘a. 567)

- Ke manao nei ka mea kakau, he mahele keia i komo ole ma na moolelo o Kamehameha i puka ma kahi wa i hala ae nei; a he mahele ano nui nohoi keia ma ka hoomaopopo ana a ka mea kakau. O ka houluulu ame ka hookaokoa ana i na hunahuna o keia ano i mea e hoopihai a ka moolelo o Ka Na‘i Aupuni, he mea waiwai nui loa ia.

Ano, e ka mea heluhelu, maanei e hooohuli ai ka mea kakau i ke kamailio ana ma kekahī mahele hou, ka mahele hoi ana i manao ai ua kau ia ma ke alahele e hoomauia ai ka moe ana o ka iwikuamoo o ka Moolelo o Kamehameha.

E hoomaopopo oe, e kuu makamaka heluhelu, mahope iho o ka hoi ana mai o ka Moi Kalaniopuu mai Maui mai, elike me ka mea i hoikeia ma kekahī o na helu i kaa-hope ae nei, a hoi hou nohoi ua Moi nei no ke kaua hou ana ia Maui. (Hoolumahiehie, *Ka Na‘i Aupuni*, Kekemapa 29, 1905)

Ku'ina Ho'i

He meiwi ho'i kēia e "ho'i hou" ai ka mea kākau i ka hopuna'ōlelo ma mua mai i mea ho'olauna i ka mana'o a hopuna'ōlelo hou e ho'oholo 'ia ai ka mo'olelo i mua (e like me ka'u i kahalalo ai ma lalo) penei.

- keia puu o Haupu, he puu ia aia i Molokai; o ke 'lii o luna o ua puu la, o Kapepeekauila ka inoa, o ke kahuna o Moi. Mai Molokai aku ka hele ana a ka puu o Haupu, a hiki i Mokuola i Hilo, Hawaii, me ke 'lii, me na kanaka, me na mea ulu o luna; a ike o Hina, makuahine o Kana ma, i ka maikai o keia aina, alaila, pii aku la e makaikai i luna. A makaikai o Hina i luna o ka puu o Haupu, o kona wa ia i lawe ia ai e ka puu i Molokai, a nele iho la o Hakalanileo i ka wahine ole, imi iho la i wahi e loaa ai ka wahine, aole e hiki. Nolaila, hele aku la o Hakalanileo i o Niheu la, e olelo aku i ka lilo o Hina i ka puu o Haupu; a lohe o Niheu i keia olelo a ko laua makuakane, olelo aku la ia: "Aole e hiki ia'u; hookahi wale no keiki e hiki ai, o Kana. E hele oe e hiki i mua ona, mai makau oe, a mai holo, ina i huli mai kela a nana ia oe, mai nana aku." A pau ka olelo aoao a Niheu ia Hakalanileo, hele aku la ia e halawai me Kana. Ia Hakalanileo i hiki aku ai i kahi o Kana, huli mai la o Kana a nana ia Hakalanileo; ma keia nana ana, ua holo o Hakalanileo me ka makau. (Fornander, 1917, Vol. 4, 'a. 437, 439)
- Ki'i 'ia akula ua lā'au nei e nā kānaka, a kauō 'ia maila i mua ona.
I ka hiki 'ana mai o ua lā'au nei a waiho 'ia i mua ona,.... Kiola aku ana kēia i ka lā'au a ia nei iā Kahikikolo, a loa'a akula 'o ia. Make loa ihola 'o 'Āhuli.

I ia make 'ana o 'Āhuli...(Kahiolo, 1998, 'a. 62)

Kohu

He mea kēia meiwi e ho'ohālike aku ana i ke 'ano o kekahī mea me kona mea "kohu," a i ka nui o ka manawa, komo nō ka 'ōlelo 'o "kohu," "me he mea lā," "'o ia nō 'oe 'o," a 'ōlelo like hou aku nō paha. Ma ka pō'aiapili o kēia 'ano meiwi, kohu mea 'a'ole nō lawa ka helu wale 'ana i ke 'ano; pono pū he ho'ohālike. Ma ka hō'ike 'ana no ke 'ano wiwo 'ole o ke koa, pono nō na'e ho'i e 'ōkomo aku he ho'okohu 'ana i ke koa me ka manō niuhi 'ai holopapa o ka moana nui e ahuwale ai kona 'ano wiwo 'ole. Eia ma lalo nei he mau la'ana ho'okohu penei.

- a makaukau na makana, nolaila ua laweia aku la o Paliuli me Hiilaniwai iloko o ka hale hula, a malaila kahi i kuhikuhia mai ai na loina o na ano a pau o ka hula. Aia iloko o keia wa, i hoikeike mai ai ua poe olohe nei he kanaono a oi me na haumana hula, aole no hoi o kanamai ua akamai i ka hula, me he mea la, aole e pa ana ko lakou mau wawae iluna o ka moena, hu ka makani o na pa-u ma ko lakou mau hope, a me he mau opua la e pipii ana iluna a ilalo, like loa ko lakou mau leo a me ke kuhi ana o na lima, a pela no hoi me ke ka-i ana o na wawae. (Manu, *Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Ianuali 3, 1885)
- Ke hele la no na waa o ua Paiea nei, oia no oe o na waa topido e olali ana iluna o ka ale. (Hoolumahiehie, *Ka Na'i Aupuni*, Kekemapa 27, 1905)

Ho'okanaka

He mea kēia meiwi e ho'okanaka aku ana i nā mea kanaka 'ole, e like ho'i me ka mea i 'ike 'ia ma ka māhele mo'olelo o Keaomelemele (Manu, *Ka Nupepa Kuokoa*, Kepakemapa 6, 1884) o ka helu 'ana aku i nā 'ōuli a pau o ka lani me ka honua i ea a'ela i hō'ailona hānau no ko Keaomelemele mua, no Kahānaiakeakua ho'i (e nānā hou i luna, i ka māhele 3.2). Eia ma lalo nei he mau la'ana hou aku o ia ho'okanaka 'ana penei:

- A makaukau ke keiki, alaila, ee ae la oia iluna o ka waa, a ia wa i pane mai ai ka makuahine: "O hele a hoi mai me na iwi o ka makua."
- "Ae, o ka leo hoi o ua mau iwi nei ka mea nana e koi nei ia'u e au hookahi i ka moana," wahi a ke keiki....

A hala ke poi'na nalu, alaila, o ae la oia i ka pe'a a kau, hoomalo mai la i ka pahee, kaomi malie iho la ke kehau huihui o ka wanaao a piha aku la ka pe'a, na ka makani ka hana, he uli wale no ka ke keiki i ka hoe mahope. (Nakuina, 1902e, 'a. 15)

Ma loko ho'i o ka mo'olelo o Kaweloleimakua (Ho'olumāhiehieka'onimālieapual ilialanaikawai, 2009, 'a. 84, 222), he mau mele kai helu 'ia i mea ho'oulu i ka lupe, iā Kahuelokū, a i ka 'upena, iā 'Ouini, e like ho'i paha me ka ho'oulu 'ana i ke kanaka a i ke akua paha penei.

E like me ka moani o kekahī 'ōpu'u rose i pua i ke ahiahi ka memele {**kohu**}, a 'o ia memele {**ku'ina ho'i**}, ua holo loa aku ia memele ma nā wēlau o ka honua {**'eko'a**}. 'O ka memele lā o ke aha? ['O] ka memele {**ku'ina ho'i**} o ke 'ala o kona pua, a 'o ia memele {**pina'i 6x ma "memele"; ku'ina ho'i**}, 'o ia ka'u e kū[w] ili ho'omau nei. No laila, ke kono a'e nei wau i ko lākou nei lokomaika'i piha, e maliu mai i ka ualo aku a kēia leo {**ho'okanaka**}. Ke kokoke aku nei kākou e hō'ea i ka MH 1879 e hiki mai ana, no laila, ke kono a'e nei wau i "Nā Keiki o ka Uhu Ka'i o Makapu'u," o "Makapu'u i ka Lae Makani" {**helu + 'ōlelo no'eau o ka inoa 'āina**}. E ala, e Waimānalo {**ho'okanaka**}, "Nā Keiki o ka Uhu Ka'i o Makapu'u" {**he 'ano akapili; 'ōlelo no'eau o ka inoa 'āina**}. Eia ka malihini hi'ikapu a Keolo'ewa {**ho'okā'au; ho'okanaka; inoa ali'i**}. E ala, e hopu, e kuilima {**helu**}! Eia mai 'o ia ke hele akula i mua o 'oukou, a na 'oukou e kuilima aku iā ia {**ho'okanaka**}.

Eia ke kama, ka hiwahiwa, ka nani, ka ‘oi ho‘okahi o kēia mau pae‘āina {***helu o ke ‘ano inoa kapakapa***} āu ho‘i e kūwili iho ai i ka ‘ono o kona mau hua‘ai, e walea ai ho‘i i kona kino melemele {***ho‘okā‘au***}. E ala, e hopu, e nā keonimana a me nā leke o ku‘u ‘āina hānau {***helu 2x***}, nona ke mele kaulana, ‘Kini Kailua, Mano Kāne‘ohe” {***kuhia inoa mele***}. E ala, e hopu, e ho‘onu‘u {***helu***} i ke kuhinia o kona kino waliwali a me kona hanu pua rose {***ho‘okā‘au***}.

E “He‘eia i ke Ko‘a Mokumoku” {***ho‘okanaka; ‘ōlelo no‘eau ma ka inoa ‘āina***}, e ala, e ho‘opau ka hākalalū ‘ana, e hopu {***helu***}! Eia mai “Ke Kilohana Po‘okela o ka Lāhui Hawai‘i” {***inoia kapakapa***}, ke hele akula {***ho‘okanaka***}. E kū a e hopu {***helu***}, hopu nō a pa‘a {***ku‘ina ho‘i***}, o lilo auane‘i i ka ‘iole, ahu ka hoka iā ‘oe {***he ‘ano ‘ōlelo no‘eau ma ka ho‘okā‘au ‘ana***}. No laila, e liuliu mua ‘oe, no ka mea, kokoke loa e ki‘ei mai ‘o Makahiki Hou {***ho‘okanaka***}. No laila, e kuilima pū mai kākou i 'ike i nā mea'ai 'ono loa a me nā mea'ai o ko nā 'āina 'ē mai, e 'ai ai 'oukou a ko'u ka pu'u i ka wai a ka Nāulu {**helu; ho'okā'au ma ka 'ōlelo no'eau**}.

No laila, mai kū a nānā wale, o hopu auane'i 'oe i ka loli, i ka i'a maka 'ole o ke kai {ho'okā'au; akapili}, o lohe pepeiao auane'i i "Ka Mo'olelo o Babel" {helu; he 'ano ku'ina ho'i}. E Waiāhole {**inoa 'āina**}, nona ka 'ōlelo 'ia, "Ho'i Kalo Pa'a i Waiāhole" {**'ōlelo no'eau**}, e ala i luna, e hopu i ka kākou Hiwahiwa {helu; inoa kapakapa}, ke kama a Kāne mā laua 'o Kanaloa {ho'okā'au ma ke akapili inoa akua}. E ala! E ala!! E ala e Kualoa {**pīna‘i; ho‘okanaka ma ka inoa ‘āina**}!!! [‘O] ka palena ho‘i o Ko‘olaupoko i Kalaeoka‘ōio {**inoa ‘āina**}. E ho‘omana‘o: ‘O ko kākou “Kilohana Po‘okela” {**ho‘okā‘au ma ka inoa kapakapa**}, eia mai ‘o ia ke naue ha‘aheo akula ma ko ‘oukou ‘ipuka hale {**ho‘okanaka**}. E heahea, e ho‘okipa aloha pumehana iā ia, e hānai ‘ai, e ho‘okūwili {**ho‘okā‘au ma ka helu me ka ‘ōlelo ku‘una**} iā ia i ‘ike i kona mau papa ‘aina mea hou {**ho‘okā‘au**}, a e ho‘olilo ‘oukou iā ia i hoa aloha kū[w]ili mau no ‘oukou i nā kau a kau {**ho‘okanaka**}. A e ho‘omana‘o ho‘i, no kona wahi ola, ‘a‘ole nō ho‘i he kaumaha loa, he ‘elua kālā, ‘o kona wahi ola wale ihola nō ia {**ho‘okanaka**}. E ala e Wai'ono {*inoa 'āina*}, e hopu i kā kākou nūpepa. E ala e Pūhe'emiki a me Kapano a me Hale'aha a me Papa'akoko {*helu ma ka inoa 'āina*}, e kū a e lōkahi i Ka Nūpepa Kū'oko'a {*inoa*}.

E ala, e Kaluanui, e ala, e Kapaka a me Makao {*pīna'i; inoa 'āina*}. Ho'okahi ka pu'uawai a ka makemake, e nā leke o ke one wali o Hau'ula a me Kaipapa'u aku ho'i. Ho'i pū mai me nā keonimana o Lā'iewai, hui pū aku ho'i me Lā'iemalo'o mai {*helu; ho'okā'au ma ka inoa 'āina*}. E lōkahi like kākou e lawe i ke Kū'oko'a. E ho'okipa iā ia ma kahi ka'awale o ko 'oukou mau home {*ho'okanaka*}.

E ala, e “Kahuku i ka Waiū o Lewa i ka Lae” {*ho'okanaka; ōlelo no'eau ma ka inoa 'āina*} 'o kā kākou pepa, eia mai ka nani o kēia kau [k]e hele aku nei, a na 'oukou ka hana, a nāna ka pē iā 'oukou {*ho'okanaka*}.

E ala, e “Waimea i ke *Kala Kōī*” {*ho'okanaka; 'ōlelo no'eau ma ka inoa 'āina*}, eia mai ka Hiwahiwa o kēia mau paemoku ke pulelo loa akula ma kēlā ‘ao‘ao, a na ‘oukou ka *ho'okipa iā ia* {*ho'okanaka; ho'okā'au; inoa kapakapa*}. Me ke aloha pumehana nona, e *ho'okipa* e hānai ‘ai a hewa *ka waha* {*ho'okā'au ma ka 'ōlelo ku'una*}.

E ala, e nā keiki o “Ke Ehu Kai o Pua‘ena” {*ho'okanaka; 'ōlelo no'eau ma ka inoa 'āina*} e liuliu mua ‘oukou iā ‘oukou iho. No laila, eia mai nō ia ke alo hou akula i nei kula loa, a e ho'omana'o ho‘i 'oukou, e hānai wahi 'ai mai iā ia. A'ole kēia he 'ano maha'oi maoli, akā, he noi aku kēia i ko 'oukou lokomaika‘i piha. Inā nō ho‘i 'a‘ole 'oukou e *ho'okipa* ana iā ia, 'a‘ole nō ia e pāweo ana; akā, 'o 'oukou paha ke pāweo ana iā ia. No laila, e hopu like kākou i 'ike i nā mea nani o kona kino lahilahi {*ho'okā'au me ka ho'okanaka*}.

Eala, e “Ewa i ka I‘a Hāmau Leo” {***ho‘okanaka; ‘ōlelo no‘eau ma ka inoa ‘āina***}, ke kokoke mai nei nā lā, a ke hō‘ea aku nei i ka makahiki 1879 e hiki mai ana. No laila, e lōkahi like pū mai kākou, e kāpae iki a‘e kākou iā ia ala, a lawe like kākou iā ia nei me ka maika‘i {***helu me ka ho‘okanaka***}.

Eala, e “Honolulu i ka Ua Kūkalahale” {***ho‘okā‘au ma ka inoa ‘āina/ua***}, e nā keiki o ke kaona, ke kokoke mai nei nā lā, no laila, e wae mua kākou, e liuliu mua, a e ho‘oka‘awale mua i wahi ‘ai nāna. A hiki mai ua lā ala, a laila, ‘o kāna wahi nō ia e ‘ai ai, ua ola ia no ho‘okahi makahiki pono‘i. ‘Elua hānai ‘ana iā ia i ka makahiki, a inā nō ho‘i ‘oe e hānai mua nō i kinohi a pau, a laila, ua hiki nō iā ia ke ola a pau ia makahiki ‘oko‘a. Kupaihanaha ‘eā? Kupaihanaha ‘i‘o ho‘i paha. ‘A‘ole paha he kanaka e like pū aku me ia nei. Pōmaika‘i kākou, inā kākou e lōkahi pū ana {***ho‘okā‘au me ka ho‘okanaka***}.

No laila, ke kau leo hou aku nei wau i “Nā Liona o ka Hikini [sic: Hikina],” puni mea hou nui wale {***kohu; he ‘ano akapili***}. Eala, e Hawai‘i nui a Keawe, e Mauí o Kama, e Moloka‘i nui a Hina, e O‘ahu o Kāku‘ihewa, a me Kaua‘i o Manokalanipō {***helu ma ka ‘ōlelo ku‘una; inoa ‘āina/ali‘i***}. E liuliu kākou a e ho‘omana‘o me ke aloha pumehana i loko o ko ‘oukou pu‘uwai aloha. E ho‘omana‘o iho: ‘O kēia makahiki e hiki mai ana, i laila kākou e ‘ike aku ai i nā u‘i ‘oi kelakela. Ke ‘ōlelo nei wau me ka hopo ‘ole: ‘O kēia ka helu ‘ekahi o ka u‘i a me ka nani mōla‘ela‘e o kona ‘ōiwi {***ho‘okā‘au ma ka ho‘okanaka***}. A laila, ua hiki loa ia‘u ke pai nona:

Maika‘i Kū‘oko‘a, hemolele i ka mālie,
Kupu kelakela ke po‘o o Kū‘oko‘a i nei mau paemoku
{ho‘okā‘au hou ‘ana i ke mele ku‘una}.

No laila, ke ho‘ōki nei au ma ‘ane‘i me ke kali aku no ua
mau lā ala e hiki mai ana {**pani**}. A laila, ‘o ko‘u mākaukau
koke no ia lā, me ka lana o ko‘u mana‘o, ‘o wau ana nō o
kākou ka lawe mua. Akā ho‘i, i ikaika nō ho‘i ‘oukou, eo ho‘i
iā ‘oukou nei makahiki a‘e. No laila, e wiki, o eo auane‘i i ke

HE MANA‘O PANI

I ho‘āla hou ‘ia ka ha‘i‘ōlelo ku‘una Hawai‘i o ke ‘ano kākā‘ōlelo, kāpilipili ihola
wau a pa‘a he ki‘ina makakolu e kilo ‘ia ai a e unuhi ‘ia mai ai ka ‘ike no loko
pono mai nō o ka mo‘okalaleo Hawai‘i ku‘una. ‘A‘ole pū ho‘i ‘o ka ha‘i‘ōlelo wale
‘ana iho nō, e like nō na‘e me ka mea i ‘ike ‘ia ma kēia kākau ‘ana, he mea pū ia e
ho‘okuana‘ike ‘ia ai ka mea ‘ōlelo Hawa‘i o kēia au a pa‘a mau nō ke ‘ano Hawai‘i
o ka ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i ‘ana. ‘O ka ‘ike i ko ke ao nei ma ke kuana‘ike Hawai‘i kauwahi
pahuhopu nui, a he maka ‘o‘oi pūkolu kēia ki‘ina e kū pū ai i ka moku ‘o Nōla‘ela‘e.

‘O ka‘u mau nīnau ho‘okele ‘elima o ke Kumu Honua Mauli Ola kekahī maka ‘o‘oi
e kū ai. He mea ko‘iko‘i ka ho‘maopopo mua ‘ana he ‘ike mo‘omeheu nō ko ka
heluhelu ‘ana e ho‘omohala ‘ia. Aia a kama‘āina, he mea pono ke ho‘okolo aku i

kona mau loina ku'una e pili pū ana, ke 'ano ho'i e lawena ai ia 'ike mo'omeheu i loko o ke ola o ke kanaka, ka lelikona kā'oko'a e ho'ākāka pono 'ia ai, a me nā 'ao'ao o ia hana e pā ai i ka 'uhane. A na'auao aku nō pēlā, he mea ho'i ia e palupalu ai ka ho'ōla pono 'ana, ka ho'omau maoli 'ana i ka 'ike kahiko i loko o ka noho 'ana o kēia au nei, a mau ai ko kākou welo kupuna.

'O ka lua aku o ka maka 'o'oi, 'o ka 'ike hualekikona. 'O ka mea nui e ho'omana'o aku nei, 'o ka 'a'apo 'ana i ka 'ike 'ōlelo o loko o kēlā me kēia māhele 'ike, o loko ho'i o kēlā me kēia pō'aiapili o ke ola kanaka. He 'ano ko ke kūka'i 'ōlelo 'ana no ka 'oihana lawai'a, he 'ano ho'i ko ka hula, he 'ano ho'i ko ka lapa'au 'ana ma nā lā'au ku'una. Pēia ho'i nā 'ike ku'una nō a pau. He mea ko'iko'i ka ho'omaopopo 'ana i ia mau 'ano 'ōlelo, he hualekikona, i mea e mau ai ke ahuwale o ia mau kumuhanā ma ko lākou mau 'ano iho nō. Ke ki'i aku nō e ho'ōla, e ki'i aku nō me kona 'ōlelo e pili pū ana, 'a'ole 'o ka 'ike wale nō. Ola nō ka 'ike imu i waena o ka po'e, pehea lā na'e ka 'ōlelo e pili pū ana: he kahūmu, he ku'i, he haka, he ho'onalo, he hua'i, he 'eho, he wahie, he lapulapu, he ulu, he hāli'i, he kauwawe, a ia hualekikona aku, ia hualekikona aku?

'O ke kolu ho'i o ka maka 'o'oi, 'o ka meiwi mo'okalaleo. He 18 meiwi i helu 'ia a'ela e a'u ma ka mea e ho'okolo 'ia ai nā hi'ohi'ona Hawai'i o ka mo'olelo Hawai'i. I lako pū me kēlā me kēia meiwi he mau la'ana i 'ohi 'ia no loko pono mai o ka hāpana mo'olelo ku'una e mōakāka iho ai. 'O ka pōmaika'i o ka 'ike meiwi mo'okalaleo, 'o ke kama'āina 'ana iho i ke kaila i ho'oholo 'ia ai he mana'o Hawai'i ('o ka 'ōlelo me ke 'ike i helu 'ia a'ela). He 'ano Hawai'i ho'i ko ke kūkulu 'ana i ka mana'o Hawai'i, a he 'ano Hawai'i ho'i ko ka ho'oholo 'ana i ia mana'o. Ke no'ono'o a'e i ka 'ōlelo a ha'i'ōlelo 'ana paha, 'o ka 'ike meiwi kekahī kōkua nui ma ia kama'āina 'ana e helu ai i ka wā kūpono, e ho'omana'o ai i nā inoa 'āina, e kaunu pū ai me nā 'ōlelo ho'okā'au, e ho'oheno pū ai me nā mele o ka 'āina, a e kōkua ai i ka mea ho'olohe ma ke akapili a ma ke ku'ina ho'i nō paha.

I loko o kēia au pā wale i ka loli nui, e hiki nō ho'i i ka mea e ake ana e ho'oikaika ke ho'omana'o iho i kēia ki'ina makakolu i mea kōkua ma ka ho'okā'eo 'ana aku i ke kuana'ike Hawai'i o ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i. Aia ho'i i loko o ka 'ōlelo a ke kanaka ke ola, aia pū nō ho'i i laila ka make. 'O ia ho'i, aia i loko o ka hiki ke unuhi mai i nā hi'ohi'ona me nā ha'awina nui o ka 'ōlelo mo'okalaleo ku'una ke ola me ka 'inana hou 'ana o ke kuana'ike Hawai'i. Aia ho'i i loko o ka hiki ke ho'opili i ia 'ike mo'okalaleo ku'una a pili i loko o ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i pa'a mau 'ana, i loko ho'i o ka pule 'ana, i loko ho'i o ka ho'omaika'i 'ana, i loko ho'i o ke kākā'ōlelo 'ana ho'i,

aia ho‘i ma laila ke kūlana ehuehu o ia ola. Ke hiki ‘ole na‘e, ke ‘i‘ini ‘ole nō na‘e ho‘i kānaka e ‘ike pēlā, e kuana‘ike iho pēlā, e pa‘a iho pēlā i loko o nā hi‘ohi‘ona ho‘opuka mana‘o, aia i laila ka māi‘u‘u o ka make e pakele ‘ole ai. He pili pono kēia i ka nohona pono o ka Lāhui Hawai‘i! No nā lāhui a pau a puni kēia poepoe honua nei, he ‘ōlelo, he mo‘omeheu, he mauli nō ho‘i. Pēia pū nō ka Hawai‘i: he ‘ōlelo Hawai‘i, he mo‘omeheu Hawai‘i, he mauli Hawai‘i nō ho‘i! E huliāmahi pū ma ka moamahi aku nō pēlā; e moe pū ke kāo‘o ‘o ka ho‘ola ‘ana aku nō pēlā! Ola!

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NO KA MEA KĀKAU

He Polopeka Kōkua ke Kauka Hiapokeikikāne Kichie Perreira ma Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikōlani o ke Kulanui o Hawai'i ma Hilo, kahi e kau nui nei kona hie i ke a'o i ka mo'okalaleo Hawai'i ku'una. He a'o pū nō 'o ia i ka mākau 'olelo Hawai'i o ka pae kula ki'eki'e ma Ke Kula 'O Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u. Noho 'o ia ma Ka'ūmana, Hilo me kāna wahine aloha 'o Hanakahi a me kā lāua mau kaikamāhine 'o Keanokualani me Keakamaluhiwa.

Hiapokeikikāne Kichie Perreira was raised in Waiau, O'ahu, and nurtured over the past 37 years by 'ohana, immediate and extended, from Hilo to Kekaha. "Hiapo" is a 1992 graduate of the Kamehameha Schools and holds a BA degree in Hawaiian Studies from the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. He became the first post-baccalaureate graduate from the University of Hawai'i at Hilo when he was awarded an MA degree in Hawaiian Language and Literature in 2002. In 2011, Hiapo became a Mellon-Hawai'i Doctoral Fellow and a year later was awarded a PhD in Hawaiian and Indigenous Language and Culture Revitalization. His dissertation centered on the revitalization of traditional Hawaiian oratory.

Perreira is currently an associate professor of Hawaiian Language and Literature at Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikōlani, University of Hawai'i at Hilo, where he has been lecturing since 1996. He has also been teaching high school Hawaiian Language Arts at Ke Kula 'O Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u since 1997. He presently lives in Ka'ūmana, Hilo, with his wife Hanakahi and daughters Keanokualani and Keakamaluhiwa.

No loko mai kēia ‘atikala hō‘ano hou nei o ka Mokuna 7 o ka‘u pepa puka lae‘ula iho nei (Perreira, 2011). Ua hiki nō ho‘i ke kilo aku i nā mana‘o piha ma laila.

See dic. for other variations of *mikolololehua*. *Ha'i'ōlelo mikolololehua*. Expressive speech, a speech to entertain." No'u pono'i iho nō, ua lilo ka hua'ōlelo 'o "mikolololehua" he hua'ōlelo e kū hō'ailona ana no ka 'ōlelo ha'ako'iko'i, 'o ia ho'i 'o ka 'ōlelo o ke 'ano mele, 'a'ole ho'i 'o ka 'ōlelo o ke 'ano kama'ilio ma'amau o kēlā lā kēia lā (e nānā iā "mikololohua" ma kā Pukui & Elbert, 1986, 'a. 247). Ua hiki ma kona 'ano he "expressive speech"; kānalua na'e wau i ka lawa o ka mana'o he "speech to entertain," oki loa ke pili ka ha'i'ōlelo 'ana i ka ho'okipa a 'aha ko'iko'i hou aku o ka pō'aiapili loina ku'una (he 'aha 'awa paha, he 'aha 'ūniki paha, he 'aha ho'ola'a paha, a ia 'ano 'aha like aku, ia 'ano 'aha like aku).

Pēia aku, a pēia aku a kālua ‘ia nā iwi o ka mea eo i loko o ka imu.

SUMMARY

The scope of this paper, based on the *Kumu Honua Mauli Ola* Philosophy of Hawaiian Being, centers on the explication of meiwi mo'okalaleo (Hawaiian ethno-literary devices) and hualekikona (lexical-items). When applied to the study of traditional Hawaiian literature, meiwi mo'okalaleo and hualekikona provide a contemporary way to analyze literary pieces, not only for cultural content, but more importantly for style and makeup. Proficiency in this respect can have a great impact on the enrichment of Hawaiian speech in general, and can contribute greatly to the composition of a neo-classical Hawaiian literary corpus (pāpā 'ōlelo, mo'olelo, kākā'ōlelo, etc.), thus preserving traditional Hawaiian style for posterity.
