Expensive Expenses



In-Direct Costs / Budget Items = Upfront Expenses

- Even if there is enough scholarship/financial aid to cover TOTAL Cost of Attendance...
 - Still upfront expenses
 - Dorm room, books, plane tickets, etc.
- Work Study ≠ Upfront
- Any “refunds” issued after school has begun

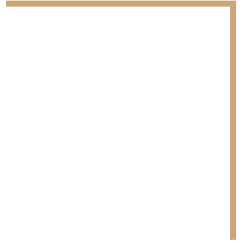
Letting go...
