

Please remember that these dorms are high school STUDENT residences. There are multiple levels with stairs and ALL the dorms have shared restrooms and shower facilities. Beds are twin size beds only. Linen is NOT provided.

## BOARDER RULES

**DUE TO LIMITED AVAILABILITY, BOARDING IS ONLY OPEN TO CLASSES CELEBRATING 15 YEARS OR MORE.**



Boarding is for adults 21 years of age or older.



NO children or pets are allowed.



NO amplified music allowed in dorms.



Boarding is limited to **ONE** celebrating graduate plus **ONE** guest.

Boarders must be registered for at least **one PAID Alumni Week event.**  
(Class events DO NOT qualify)

Overnight stays must be a **minimum of two (2) consecutive nights.** (i.e. you may board Thursday, Friday & Saturday but not Thursday and Saturday).

All boarders must sign a WAIVER AND RELEASE form at check-in.

**Dorms will close at 1:00 a.m. to non-boarders throughout Alumni Week.**

## BOOKING COST

***\$35.00 per night, per person***

Boarders' guests (limited to only **ONE** per celebrating graduate) will be assessed a one-time \$8.00 Alumni Week processing fee. Cost includes mini breakfasts beginning Wednesday morning, June 6th through Saturday, June 9th.

## WHAT TO BRING

Boarders need to provide their own twin sheets, pillows, pillowcases, blankets, towels and clothes hangers. Washers, dryers and irons are available in the dorms.

## REGISTERING FOR EVENTS

You are welcome to sign up for all events; however, please sign up only for events you plan to attend. **NO ALCOHOL** is allowed at events except for the *lū'au* where alcohol is available for purchase. No outside alcohol is allowed.

All activities are sold individually. Each event requires a reservation and a ticket, with the exception of the Opening and Memorial Chapel services. There is a maximum of two (2) tickets per event per graduate. **NO** exceptions.

Priority of registration will be by the date full payment is received. It is highly recommended that you register online with payment by credit or debit card to guarantee that your registration has been confirmed.
