



New Policy

Important Note: All students are limited to earning no more than 1 social studies graduation requirement credit during the course of four summers. For example, a student may take Hawaiian History (0.5 credit) and Economics (0.5 credit), or US History (1 credit), or World History (1 credit) in a summer. Administrative approval must be received prior to registering or taking credits beyond the 1 credit limit. If a student exceeds the 1 credit limit without prior administrative approval he/she will be required to repeat the course during the regular school year. The administration may approve exceptions to this policy for boarding students and for students who need to make up social studies credits during the summer.



Dual Credit Program

What is Dual Credit?

Dual Credit: The opportunity to earn high school and college credit at the same time; students completing a single course to earn academic credits that are recognized by two



Why consider Dual Credit?

Potential for shortened time to Bachelor's degree

- Easier transition to college
- Option to take a lighter credit load 1st semester at college
- Increased ability to double major/minor
- Cost savings potential

Graduating from college early allows for

- Entering the job market ahead of college classmates
- Completing a graduate degree before peers have a bachelors
- Internship, travel, volunteer, mission work...

Impact of Dual Credit

- KSK grade = College grade
- Grade appears on BOTH transcripts
- KSK DC grade is a weighted 5.0 scale
 - A = 5.0 vs. 4.0
- Higher GPA impacts College Admission & potential merit scholarships
- DC students tend to do better academically

Dual Credit Cautions



- Give your best effort and take ALL academic courses seriously
- College transcripts begins with FIRST dual credit course taken
- Academic dishonesty consequences may be leveled at BOTH institutions
- Course is free, BUT families must repay KS IF course is not completed, or an F is earned (regardless of KS Financial Aid status)
- Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)/2.0 GPA AND Financial Aid eligibility can be impacted by "F"ailing even ONE dual credit course
