As we continue to grow as the class of 2026, our mission as your ATP representatives is to strengthen and foster relationships amongst our lāhui.

### **Return to Campus**

Please keep in mind that our administrators are following government guidelines to ensure the safety, health and wellbeing of our children. KMS has a unique physical building of an open floor concept, therefore, with the hybrid schedule of being on campus 2x per week, the physical capacity of 6 foot distancing is being maximized. In addition, like all native populations, as Native Hawaiian, we are under the category of "high risk".

Student Wellness Check - Parents will need to complete the Student Wellness Check Google form the morning of (not the night before) each oncampus day. The form needs to be submitted prior to boarding the bus and proof of clearance will need to be shown to the bus driver at temperature check. If arriving on campus by car, it will need to be done before drop-off at Kekūhaupi'o. On the form you will need to enter your child's email address as follows: firstname.lastname@imua.ksbe.edu

- Bus Applications go to Transportation Department, not KMS office
- Car Drop off for middle school is at Kekūhaupi'o
- School hours: 7:45 a.m. 2:30 p.m. (Drop off begins 7:00 a.m. Pick up by 3:00 p.m.)

**PPE**: Each child should have received a total of 5 face masks and 3 face shields. Students may only use KS issued face masks or plain disposable ones on campus. KS issued masks include the mask our keiki received from KES as well as our class mask that was offered through Warrior Printing. There are no additional KMS masks available for purchase.





**Safety Protocols Online Training**: Each parent and student will need to complete this training prior to the return to campus; the training can be found on KS Connect.

KS Kapālama student travel policy: If you plan to travel out of state during the holiday season, please familiarize yourself with the KS travel policies.
