Optional:

- scissors

Below is a picture with some helpful information on how to collect ti leaf. We will need 10-15 large full green ti leaf.

Seek and gather

- ~ Take your time
 - ! Intention, seek permission
- ~ Starting from the bottom lau
 - ! Pull the 'au kī downward
- ~ Leave 5-7 lau from top
 - ! Be careful not to snap top off
- ~ Don't cut!!
